KILLED, WOUNDED AND PRISONERS The South Pacific Times of Oct. 28th

Peru on the 22nd ult. Callao, Oct. 28th The Pacific, which arrived on the

25th instant, brings intelligence of an armed expedition. Nearly a month ago we were informed that a large vessel (our informant said it was the English steamer Arizona) laden with munitions of war, had passed through the Straits of Magellan and was at anchor in a small port in the South of Chile, awaiting orders, which it was expected would lead to a landing being made at Arica. It appears that a vessel named the Talisman, after coaling at Coronel, call-

ing at Quinteros, near Valparaiso, for arms and men, and afterwards again coaling at Caldera, lett for Arica. The names of the leaders of this expedition are given as Messrs. Pierola, Bogardus, Escobar, Larenas, Gonzales and Larrañaga, and they are accompanied by nearly two hundred Chilians. The Talisman is a small steamer of about 450 tons burthen and 115 horse-power, and we believe has peen employed for some time past in the coasting trade of the Argentine Republic. She is commanded by Captain Haddock, who formerly be

gives the following news-"The topsail rigged propeller Talisman, ostensibly from Cardiff, Wales. cast anchor in this port yesterday. 




