Cotton-growing. Continued.

The soil and climate, of the The soil and climate, of the majority of the provinces, are ad-mirably adapted to the growth of cotton, and especially of the Sea Island or finer descriptions. cotton plant, we are informed, grows wild in the province of Santiago de Estero and many arts of Corrientes. All that is requisite for the purpose is a little energy on the part of those in power, and a numerous agricul-tural importation from Europe.

The climate is of unsurpassed salubrity. There are slight frosts in the winter months, but not sufficient to kill the cotton plant. In summer the heat rarely exceed. 85 deg.Fahr,although it sometim ob deg.r and even exceeds, 100
deg. during the hot winds. The
nights are generally cool
pleasant, even in summer. The cotton plant stands the heat and drought remarkably well. In the summer months of December, January and February, the plants are generally in flower in the pro-vinces. The cotton harvest, if there were any in these coun-

Trues, would extend probably from January till April.

Fabulous, in the extermey are the accounts of the yield of an acre of cotton, and we doubt much if they are not exaggerated. However, we are informed that in Catamarca, an acre of cotton will yield from 950 to 1300 lbs of Sea Island cotton in the seed. The boe and wooden plough are the only instruments used, and many persons assert that the soil would not be exhausted for

whole century. Cotton, we are informed, may be planted any month in the year, but April or May is usually pre-ferred. The wild cotton trees ferred. The wild cotton trees grow to a great height, but, if properly trimmed, so that a man could reach it, would yield for
