Congress on the Capital. The debate of yesterday was the most animated ever witnessed inB Aires, The bar was crowded, and Sor Costa's magnificent oration Sor Costa's magnificent oration had a talismanic effoct on the House. In truth we lind always funcied the prime-minister a ge-nius of the second order; but his masterly defence of the bill has so completely annihilated all oppo-sition, that we congratulate the Government on possessing so able a champion. From press of space we are obliged to make extracts

of his speech.

Dr. Costa said. I have list ned with pain to the offensive allusions thrown out by some impassioned debaters against the ge vernment, and as its representati must repel these injuriesthe same time I congratulate the Chamber and people on this li-berty of speech the greatest con-quest ever secured by even the

grandest revolutions.

We are charged with intending to initiate a pure Unitario system through the Republic, but I hold that such is impossible in many of the provinces, such as Cordoba, Entre Rios &c. which have their traditional forms of Government. I defy the opposition to cite a single city which has refused the honor of ca capital when offered.

- The National power must not go about begging for a capital. Buenos Ayro, like the daughter of Pharoah, should now rescue the cause of union, which, like Moses, will lead them to the promised land (applause and his-ses). We have been charged with murdering the province of Bue-nos Ayres, but I take up the con-sutution of this province, and find it requires three powers—Execu-tive, Legislative and Judicial. None of these is materially affected. What matters it whether the Executive be titled President or Governor?

I confess that I am ashamed the opposition should have quoted as allies, Dorrego, Artigas Qui roga and such disgraceful charac-We are charters in our history. ged with violating the Constitu-tion. For the sake of argument I will grant it - but let the opposition not base their objection a dry point of theory, or articles of a miserable Constitution! The question here is the public good, and if even we violate 50 chimerical articles, I care not. It is alleged that this measure is a monstrosity, and my learned fri-end [Dr. Montesdeoca] who is, I believe, a homeopathic professor should know the principle of his craft—similia similibus urcan-It is true the idea is monstruous, but such also is our condi-tion. After 50 years sickness the tion. After 50 years sickness the Republic is given over by the Doctors, as kepeless—and the refere we must try the homeop this treatment—cure one cvil by another. What have we done our-ing balf a century? In that period kingdons have grown up and deserts become populated, while here our interior provinces have been a pandemonium of civil war and Bucnos Aires has proceeded lazily in the onward path of this age of advancement.

Government only consults the national welfare: we rely on the patriotism of the local Chambers, but should they throw out the measure, we count on popular ap probation to gain this great point, whereon depend the hopes of the epublic (great applause).

There are many of our citi There are many of our citi-zens who sigh for the good old times when beef and mutton were to be had for asking, before the foreigners came with their mercenary ideas of turning every thing into money. In the days of Spamsh rule, when English merchants, Irish shepherds and merchants, Irish shopberds and French watchmakers were unk-nown, there was such an abun-dance of silver that the most vul-gar articles of domestic furniture vere made of the precious metal. Living was cheap, and specie plenty, so that really Bucnos Ai es might be considered an El Dorado, in the beginning of the present century

How lamentably the picture is now reversed: since the influx of foreigners, silver has disappeared, state currency become almost I krupt and all the necessaries ifer isen to an enormous figure far exceeding anything of the kind ever known in the Old or New World. Doublooms have gone up from 17 to 420.-Beef once worth a cent per lb costs now half a silver dollar. Bread is worth its weight in silver. Ten is dearer than in England. Su-gar is a formidable item in house expenses. Butter, coal, milk and such auxiliares help wonderfully to drain the purse of pater-fami lies; while house-rent and muni-cond tax swamp the largest profits,Cand police lines, on whatever excuse, reduce one's coach-andfour to a modest cabriolet or dog

"Post hoc ergo ex hoc, -The Portenos, generally, seem to con-clude that this wonderfur change is owing to the influx of foreig-ners which preceded it; on thesaorse is the me reasoning that a h cause of a cart, because he goes before it. It we look, however, to the real origin, we will find it to the remarkable change of customs. Every day the extravaincrease, and Buenos Aires, while occupying a fifth-rate position in the scale of capitals, attempts to rival Paris. London, or Dublic, in exterior and domestic magnificence.

Government should at once proscribe every object of luxury, and banish billiard-players and other us-less members, as ene mies to the state. How many young fellows pass their days in ignoble indolence eating the bread for which others ban lies sweat.

Until we imitate Paraguay whose exports exceed her inports, we shall be continually
