MUNICIPAL EXPERTS. Will take place in all the parishes of the capital the 30th of this month, for the investigation of that corporation.

ANNUAL REPORT. The new committee appointed to examine the Arátean well at Durazno has presented their report to the Government.

4th-Slate and requirements of the Police Dept. men.

They must report on the efficacy of the police force at their disposal, and means to be adopted if its increase becomes necessary.

5th-State of public lands in the town limits, how many have been sold, and how many still on sale.

The Government trusts that they will pay the highest attention to the subject, as also in indicating the most adequate means for the greater order and security of their respective parishes.
