GERMANY AND DENMARK.

The definite treaty of peace between Prussia. Austria and Denmark was signed October 30. It contains 24 arlicies and a protocol providing for the evacuation of Jutland within three reeks.-

The principal provisions of the treaty re as follows:

All previous treaties between the contracting parties, not expressly an mulled, are to be considered as in full operation.

Denmark renounces in favor of Aus ria and Prussia all her rights to the Duchies, including the islands belonging to Schleswig.

The frontiers between Schleswig and Denmark are rectified by mutual ces sians of small portions of territory.

Austria and Prussia guarantee the ayment of 29,000,000 thalers, fixed as the portion of the Danish National deb ertaining to the Duchies.

Denmark is to be indemnified for the biced contributions levied in Jutland, nd the Duchies will repay to the Allies the expenses of the war.

The vessels and cargoes captured or sither side during the war will be re stored, or their owners indemnified.

The natives of the Duchies serving in the Danish army and navy will have the option to continue in or to leave the

Commercial relations between Den mark and the Duchies are to be on the footing of the most favored nation.

The Danish Rigsraad proposed the financial modifications rendered neces sary by the loss of the Duchies.

BUICHERY OF WOMEN AND CHILDREN.

Among the fugitives from Paysandú itely arrived in this city is an unforunate man who owes his life to Capt. Johnson, H. B. S. Dotorell. His story s one of the most horrible we have ever heard. The Brazilians entered his house in the attack on Paysandú, and cut the throats of his wife, sister-in law, 3 children, and a servant-maid. The wretched man, after this total sacrifice of his family by the imperial troops, contrived to get on board the British gunboat, and tells the butchery with every appearance of truth.

We would gladly deny credence to the tale, were it not borne out by several passengers who have come from the Uruguay, with narratives of wholesale massacres by the Brazilians, sparing neither women or children.

The heroic Leandro Gomez is charged with great severity, in shooting several citizens supposed to be disaffected to the garrison. His conduct in hanging 24 Brazilian prisoners is generally justified by impartial foreigners, on the grounds that the Brazilians had not declared war. Some even go so far as to applaud this act.

It is much regretted that the English and French commanders did not join the captain of the. Wad-ras, and effeetually prevent the wanton and barbarous bombardment of Paysandú. All classes in B.
