The Galicia's Mails.

London, Jan. 28th
The House of Lords sat for only a few minutes last evening.

In the House of Commons the debate on Mr Foster's motion for the introduction of a Bill for the Protection of Life and Property in Ireland was resumed by Mr Labouchere. Mr Bright took part in the debate, which, having lasted till midnight, was again adjourned.

Sir George Colley, in a telegram to the War Office, dated Mount Prospect, Jan. 27th, states that his advance has been stopped by rains and mist. From Durban we learn that a patrol from Pretoria has surprised and captured a Boer laager after severe fighting, in which the enemy, who fled, abandoning their stores, lost 27 killed, and many wounded. The British loss was four killed and many wounded. Telegraphic communication with the Transvaal has been restored.

Yesterday two Blue-books were issued, containing despatches respecting the Montenegrin frontier question.

A telegram from our special correspondent in Central Asia states that, in the sortie from Geok Tepe on the 10th inst., the Turcomans captured sixty prisoners, whom they immediately murdered. Our correspondent adds that the Tekkes, if beaten, intended to emigrate to Merv and Persia. Our correspondent in St. Petersburg telegraphs that much satisfaction is felt there at the fall of Geok Tepe, and that General Scobie left is gazeted to the rank of full general. In military circles it is considered certain that, in order to keep the Tekkes effectually in check, Askabat must be occupied.

In yesterday's sitting of the French Senate the Bill relating to the granting of bounties to the merchant marine was adopted by 265 to 5 votes.

We learn by telegram from Africa that the blockade of Callao has been raised.

The polling for Edinburgh took place yesterday, when the Lord Advocate of Scotland received 11,390 votes, as against 3,940 given to Mr Edward Jenkins. The Lord-Advocate's majority was thus 7,450.

Prince Leopold, the President of the Kyrie Society, yesterday took the chair at the first meeting held to promote its objects, which took place in the Kensington Town-hall. Princess Louise was also present. Resolutions in support were spoken to by Dr W H Alchin, Mr G A Sala, Mr William Morris, the Rev. Teignmouth Shore, M Kegan Paul, Mr J G Fitch, and others.

At the annual conference of the National Liberal Federation, held at Birmingham yesterday, resolutions were adopted thanking the Government for the introduction of the Corrupt Practices Bill, recognizing in it an earnest and able attempt to deal effectively with the subject, and stating that, while reserving its opinion upon certain points of detail, the meeting earnestly trusted that Government will resist any attempt to weaken its provisions, to limit the area of its operations, or to delay its passage through Parliament.

Yesterday the Attorney-General presided over a very numerously-attended meeting of the members of the Bar, held in the Inner Temple Hall, at which a resolution moved by Mr Forsyth, Q.C., and seconded by Mr Sergeant Robinson, was carried, declaring that the Lord Chief Justice of the Common Pleas, and the Lord Chief Baron of the Exchequer ought to continue to preside in those Divisions. A petition to Parliament embodying the terms of the resolution was agreed to.

According to the meteorological return, temperature yesterday was as high as 53 degrees at our extreme south-western stations, 41 to 43 over our western and south-eastern counties, and 35 to 38 elsewhere. Last evening's observations showed but little change over the greater part of our islands; but at our most southern stations the barometer was falling again steadily.

Lord Coleridge had before him in the Queen's Bench yesterday the case of "Bastendorff v. Purkess," which was an action for libel arising out of the publication by the defendant of a pamphlet, shortly after the Boston-square murder, purporting to be an "Extraordinary Statement of Hannah Dobus." A denial on oath having been given by Mr. Bastendorff to the allegations complained of, a verdict was taken by consent for £500 damages.

At the last-half-yearly meeting of the National Bank yesterday, Mr. Massey, M.P., the chairman, spoke of the returning prosperity of Ireland as indicated by the fact that the amount due on deposits and current accounts had increased during the half-year by a quarter of a million, and that the past-due bills which had been accumulating for some years had been materially reduced. He also intimated that the directors have it in contemplation to propose at the next half-yearly meeting that the bank should be brought under the Limited Liability Act.

Mr. John Prender, M.P., in presiding at the half-yearly meeting of the Eastern Telegraph Company, mentioned that £10,000 had been spent in picking up one of their cables at a depth of 2,000 fathoms,

which had been ten years in the water. The establishing of the fact that it was possible to raise a cable from such a depth gave an additional value to all telegraphic property.

The stock markets yesterday were firmer, and closed at a general recovery for the day, but under the best points touched. Consols rose 5/- London and South Western Railway Stock 13/- (upon the declaration of a dividend at the rate of 73 per Cent.; Great Western 13/-, American and Canadian lines were higher, and Egyptian and most other foreign bonds left off at an advance. £30,000 in gold was sent into the Bank of England.

THE WEATHER

The sudden change of weather in the direction of a thaw which took place on Wednesday evening transformed in many respects the appearance of the streets and parks of the metropolis yesterday; for although there was actual frost during Wednesday night it was of so mild a character as not materially to affect the thawing process. The change in temperature has been almost unprecedented, for, while the thermometer at the Hyde-park Receiving-house registered on Tuesday night a minimum of 16 deg., or 16 of frost, it marked during Wednesday night a minimum of 33 deg., or 1 above freezing point, which showed a rise in temperature in 24 hours of 17 deg. The condition of the streets was fitly in the extreme. The appearance of the Thames was vastly different yesterday from that which it presented during the past fortnight. The pieces of drift ice which floated up and down with the tide were no longer white-crested, but of a dirty blue-black colour. At low water the huge ice boulders which were to be seen like masses of rock high and dry upon the shore had disappeared, and there were the first signs of returning traffic on the great river in the many steam-tugs which cut their way through the masses of ice, and dragged after them rows of barges. The appearance of the parks was not materially changed, for the thaw had not set in sufficiently long to destroy the white covering of the grass. The footways were deep in sloppy snow, and the ice on the ornamental waters had upon it from two to three inches of water. In Hyde-park especially the fog was very dense.
