appreciating the general vim of the performers, cannot but have their sympathy more or less awakened in favour of certain individual characters, either from some fancied, perhaps superior artistic attainments of those that represented them, or from some constitutional bias for the parts themselves.

Now, of the two representations of Wednesday evening, some prefer the comedy, others the burlesque. As the former seems the favourite theme of the newspaper reports, we would beg to substantiate as well the claims of the latter. In the first place, the operette is not only a novelty to our amateurs, but is also the most difficult to execute, for it requires, besides fair voices and a knowledge of music, certain superior scatological attainments. The operette, too, might be advocated on other grounds than these: it is more easily understood by the public generally. The fine points of an English comedy are lost to a general audience, while everybody, whether English or otherwise, cannot fail to appreciate an operette, especially when the theme is well known and ably executed. If this observation holds true, it should not be forgotten, for by widening the sphere of action it tends to ensure a numerous and permanent audience. There were not a few present the other evening who compared, not unfavourably, all things considered, our amateurs' performance with that of the old French troupe, led on by such capital comedians as Mollard and Colombet. Like many other owls or birds of evil augury, I pressed a "fiasco," but now I am glad to acknowledge that the success attained has given me more satisfaction than the somewhat wicked and malicious pleasures I indulged in with the anticipation of an utter break-down. In my opinion, and in that of many more, considering the innovation on the previous performance, this was by far the best given. The burlesque was good from beginning to end.

The chorus, of which nothing has been said, was excellent, very well trained, well led, and, as it should be, numerous and harmonious; besides, the gentlemen that made up the chorus stood well in their boots. I have seen bigger boots in the Colon, but no such legs and legs are very substantial things.

But, taken on the whole, the pain should be given to Faust and Mephistopheles, not only because these parts are the most difficult and the principal ones, but also from the good, artistic way in which they were executed.

Mr. Miller's get-up was, without bombast, just as good as that of most persons who have represented Mephistopheles comically, or otherwise, in Buenos Aires. He sang well, was at his ease, and entered thoroughly into his part.

Faust must have been a great surprise to many, but not to those acquainted with Mr. Biggs. He is an artist by nature and study, and he brought to his aid on the present occasion that delicate, subtle, inborn talent which he evinces in those beautiful little works of art which occasionally exhibited in the picture shops of Buenos Aires. We trust his gentle, modest and retiring character will never prevent him from placing at the disposal of every good cause those talents with which he is so happily endowed. If the studio is his favorite mistress, he must not turn a deaf ear to nuptial quire as fair—Dulce est dissipare in loco?

In conclusion: if Mr. Martin has been riding many a time against the stream, he has formed an institution, and in the mind's eye, I see him wading calmly down the tide that leads to the mighty ocean of fame; and as he is too good to harbour jealousy I shall repeat, now that I am on the classics—"Macte virtute esto puer, or in other words—Proced, bold boy, on your glorious and virtuous career!"

The Government organ declares that the rebels at Salto are merely a pack of bandits; but this is the stale old compliment invariably paid by "patriots" in power to patriots out of power in this part of the habitable globe. Disposition amongst the officers in the army is mixed, and is not improbable, as Latorre's regime was the best for the military element ever known in B.O. The fight near Salto was of the usual order—two flags, ten lances and a solitary "rodeado" captured; one Government man grazed and three rebels gone for good, besides two captured. Simon Martinez led the invaders, who numbered 23 in all. When the fight was lost S.M. made for Peñolas. "En fin, the whole affair is but a repetition of what we have all read so often in the annals of Banda

Oriental patriotism. The sooner Latorre again puts an end to it all the better.

The delicious weather was the topic in every mouth yesterday. A visitor from London who called at our office exclaimed, as he fanned himself with a Lincoln and Bennett which shone like jet, "By Jove, Standard, if they could get such a day in London in the middle of winter, they would make the Argentines a present of the 20 millions the provinces is now trying to borrow there." Our Cordoba colleagues might do a service by translating the following (from the *Southern Cross* of Friday last). The simple remedy is said to have cured upwards of 3000 cases in England lately:

"Cream of tartar.... 4 ounces  
Rhubarb..... 12 grains  
Cold water..... 1 pint  
The dose is from a quarter to half a pint. In severe cases a pint dose should be administered. In cases characterized by delirium great benefit has been derived by applying a bottle of hot water to the feet.

Plenty of fresh air is important and an out-door airing at the earliest period practicable is recommended. When applied in the earliest stage of eruption, the eruption is arrested and suppuration prevented without any injurious result. SHEEPFARMING IN THE SOUTH.

In the interest of our numerous friends in the camp we give hereunder copies and translation of original documents by which it will be seen that away in the south, in the far distant partido of Mar Chiquito, there is an establishment that for purity of its fine sheep breeds, can rival any of the best caballos in the country. Nor is it the experiment of a couple of years only; as far back as 1855 Mr Thomas Gaynor began his labors, persevering steadily through seas, revolutions, tempests and other drawbacks, anyone of which might well deter a man of less resolution from risking his capital in so dangerous an undertaking whilst a certain fortune awaited him in the old and less troublesome system of sheepfarming.

In Europe, where the sheep runs are small, the system of housing and stallfeeding may be preferable, but here the case is different, and no matter how fine or fullblooded sheep may be, no animals are worth a dollar that are not properly acclimated.

Mr Gaynor has made two trips to Europe; in 1872, and again in 1873. On both occasions he made large and valuable purchases, amongst others a prize ram No. 54, which had won the gold medal, and to procure which even at the high price of 10,000 mpc, it was necessary to buy four other animals, as the document bearing M. Gilbert's signature clearly proves. Unlike other breeders Mr Gaynor sends no rams to the city auction marts, and those who want his fine stock must go to the estancia, only 6 leagues from the Ayacucho station of the G. Southern Railway, where they will be kindly received by the hospitable owner. Even from the North and West camp buyers arrive of late, but we think that, given the difference of temperature, these animals are better fitted for the colder regions of Bahia Blanca and Patagonia, and to the farmers of those remote districts we particularly recommend the perusal of the following documents:

In 1862, at the International Show in London, our rams were highly recommended, no prize being offered for Merinos bred in England, and at the exhibition a medal was awarded us for wool from this flock.




