ATTEMPT ON THE QUEEN'S LIFE. The following particulars relating to the attempted assassination of the Queen, as her Majesty was leaving Windsor Station, for the Gaule, yesterday evening, contain the latest items of information furnished today:—

From an eye-witness of the attempt, the Press Association learns the following additional particulars: The passage to the Windsor Railway Station was protected by police constables and officials of the Great Western Railway. The starting of Her Majesty's special train was communicated to Mr Smyth, the station-master, a few minutes before five.

Immediately after the Queen drove out of the railway station, the man, who was not known in Windsor, was marched off between files of police, surrounded by men and women, crying for Lynch law, to the police-station.

found that he had been located three days at Windsor, and was observed on the railway platform on Tuesday last, when Her Majesty left for town. This circumstance leads to the belief that he was specially located at Windsor for the assassination of Her Majesty.

At Marlborough House there have been numerous inquiries. Nearly all the members of the present and late Ministry have called and left their cards. Among the more distinguished callers were Sir Bartle and Lady Freer, Cardinal Manning, the Archbishop of Canterbury, Mr. Alfred Tennyson, Sir Henry and Lady Holland, the Earl and Countess Sefton, the Marquis and Marchioness of Headfort, Count Munster, the German Ambassador and Colonel Maude, arrived at Windsor by the Great Western Railway before noon, and drove to the Castle, where they offered their congratulations to Her Majesty on her presidential escape.

The prisoner was first seen at Windsor on Saturday last, when he proceeded to the neighbourhood of Victoria Cottages, one of the poorest districts in the borough, and there he inquired for lodgings of a Mr. Palmer, a greengrocer. Palmer returned the man to a Mrs. Knight, at Victoria Cottages. He arrived at six o'clock in the evening, and Mrs. Knight said it was her custom to have a deposit from her lodgers, and then gave her a shilling. The lodgings were for 2s. 6d. per week, and the prisoner occupied a room on the first floor. He said he was a grocer's assistant, and had a place in view at Eton. As he had been travelling about he had not received money, but he had a weekly allowance. On Wednesday Mrs. Knight, who waited on Maclean, says he showed anything but a desponding disposition, but he kept his overcoat buttoned over his chest as though he were hiding something. She saw no firearms about, and had not the slightest suspicion about him. He staid in doors all Wednesday, and told Mrs. Knight that he was expecting a letter, but none came.

He was most peculiar in his habits, putting his head up the chimney to illustrate his ventiloquial powers and disclaiming quotations from Shakespeare. He had originally intended remaining several months at Southsea, but shortened his stay through an apprehension that his friends would cut off his allowance. He used to frequently talk about lunatic asylums, and said that he had once written to the Home Secretary with reference to the affairs of the poor, and had induced the right hon. gentleman to alter the law. He asked whether the Queen was at Osborne, and upon obtaining an affirmative reply, inquired whether he would be allowed to visit that place, and whether he could sketch there. He was also asked to know if the Queen was usually attended while out walking, and whether she would acknowledge him if he spoke to her. Before starting for London he heard that Her Majesty had left the Isle of Wight, and that the Royal marriage would take place at Windsor. A remittance from Oxydon now awaits him at Ouel-grove, and when he left he had a carpet-bag, but it was not known what was in it.

A Windsor Correspondent, telegraphing at a quarter to nine, says Inspector Noble, of the Great Western Railway Company's Police, and Inspector Turner, of the Locomotive Department at Slough, arrived at Windsor at half-past seven, and commenced a search of the yard for the purpose of discovering, if possible, the bullet fired last night at Her Majesty. After a search, which lasted about an hour and a quarter, Inspector Turner found a small bullet embedded in the ground.

The bullet weighs about a third of an ounce, being conical in shape. Upon inspection it was seen that it was slightly grazed, and had some red paint upon it, showing that it had struck a red railway truck, and, being spent, had fallen. The distance from the spot from which the bullet was fired to where it was found is 29 yards. The bullet is now in the hands of the police, and has been placed alongside the other bullets found on Maclean, and ex-

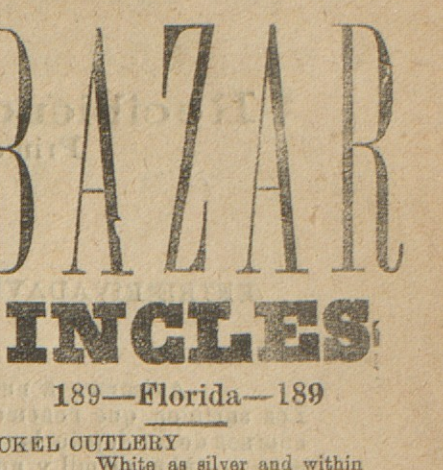

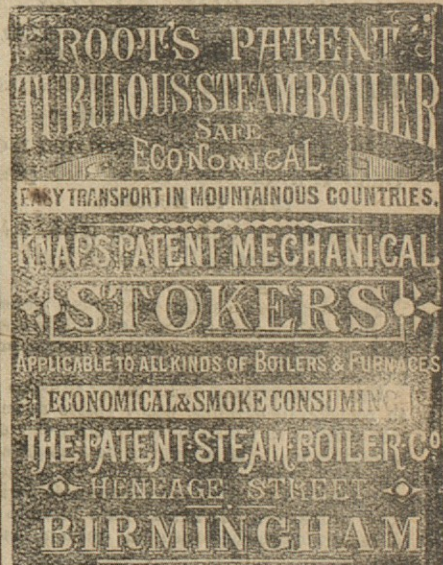

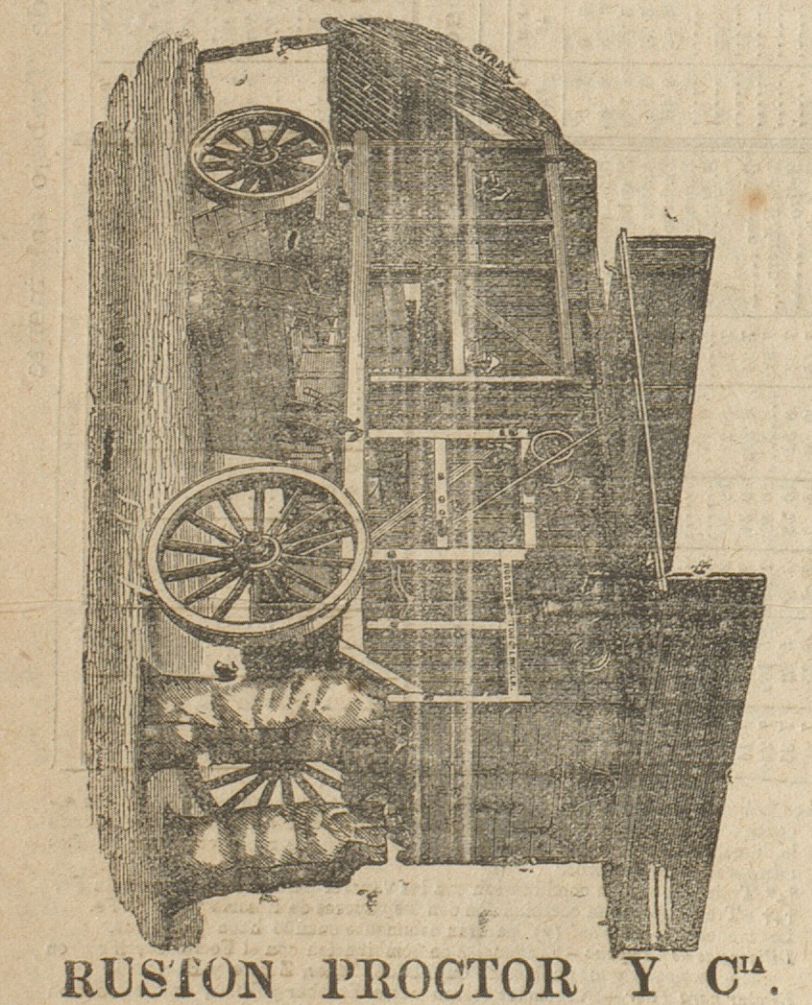
