TRADE STATISTICS.

The following tables of the Foreign Trade of Buenos Ayres have just been published by Mr. F. Latzina, Director of the National Statistical Department. As the figures are official, they will, of course, be all the more interesting. At first sight it would seem that the trade of the country for the past year has fallen off, since the aggregate import and export trade for that year only amounted to \$8 millions, but against 116 millions for the previous year, but it must be always remembered that these tables before us only refer to the trade of the port of Buenos Ayres, and not to the trade of the whole country; it is reasonable to suppose that if the trade of Buenos Ayres alone reaches 88 millions, that of the whole Republic will amount to at least 120 millions pats.
