## OPENING OF CONGRESS.

To-day President Roca opens his third Congress amidst a glamour of unspeakable uneasiness in the history of these countries. This Congress stands on the central axis of his administrative period, and may therefore be regarded with a species of mystic significance; the country has advanced so much during his first three years rule, that it is a fair question to ask, will it do as much in the next three years? We for our part find little difficulty in replying in the affirmative, and we base our answer not upon mere enthusiasm, which we are always charged, but upon the facts and figures of the world, there is not much to object to in the proposed treaty. It is, however, doubtful if Portugal will agree to the conditions imposed, and what gives a serious account to the whole question is the undoubted but not acknowledged fact, that the British Government are stirring up this old claim of Portugal as a protection against the French influence of the throne.

In the Congo the question might be arranged by simply following up for the present the principle rudely applied in the now existing International Association of Traders.

I send you separately an account of the funeral of the late Mr. John Brown, and also what little Irish news there may be.

I may mention that the gentleman who stated that he saw Lady Florence Dixie during the time she imagined herself attacked by Fanias, has, in answer to an indignant denial of his statements from that lady, formally reduced his evidence to writing, and clearly shows that, contrary to Lady Florence's supposition, he saw her standing in the grounds of the Fishery at the very time the "yellow carb." The Guardsman, &c., passed, and that she went quickly back to her house unassisted. Notwithstanding this evidence, it is difficult to believe that the French ambassador will agree to the conditions imposed, and what gives a serious account to the whole question is the undoubted but not acknowledged fact, that the British Government are stirring up this old claim of Portugal as a protection against the French influence of the throne.

A most interesting debate took place

this week in the House of Commons,

on the second reading of the Bill of Criminal Appeal Bill.

It was naturally

and ineffectually opposed by the Tory members, in an irregular way,

and the bill was passed.

The International Association has five more

squares, the session proved remarkably sterile.

Let us all hope that in this session

more business will be done. The

unification and converging all the debts

of the nation into a 5 per cent debt

is a scheme of great importance, and

we hope to see it passed. Our readers

may remember that it was brought

before Congress last session, but owing

to the pressure of other bills, it had to stand over.

The bill will, however, come up again now, and possibly

we may see this year the amortization

system abolished, and the public debt

and the bonds replaced; same as the

custom in the United States and in

other countries.

One of the most important of all

measures is that proposed by the Pre-

sident, namely, that at certain fixed

and stated points in the national terri-

tories, a district or site of 16 square

leagues be marked out and handed

over at once to the emigration depart-

ment for settlements and colonization.

In this area will be comprised, a

site for a village, for chalets of 20

squares each, around that village, and

also small strips of estancia lands, say

j a league each. All these to be given free to colonists. This is the project of the Government.

At the required points, be private property,

The President of the Republic, it

seems, has set his hand upon making

three great National Railways, one

to run from Bahia Blanca to Bariloche,

another across the Missions, and a third

to connect Bolivia with the Paraná,

and open a highway through the Cha-

có. These measures will also be laid

before Congress. At present there are

14,000 men at work on the railway

extensions going on in the Republic;

if they pass these new schemes, we

shall have 30,000 men at work on our

railways, and it is this great public

employment, which exists in the Plate,

that pushes everything ahead so fast.

In a few months we shall have some

5,000 men working in this city on the

Improvement Works, which will give

a fresh impetus to city trade.

This new Congress is, therefore,

called to play a very important role

in public affairs, and as the session

opens two or three weeks before its

usual time, we may look forward to a

very active dispatch of business this

term.
