LATEST NEWS

PRESS TELEGRAMS.

The following epitome of the latest news by telegraph, from all quarters, is taken from our colleagues.

Rosario, 12th.

A NEW RAILWAY.

A leading native colleague has published some very interesting details regarding a proposal to construct a railway from the town of Bahia Blanca to the Andes and Chile. A company has been formed, according to our colleague, by Messrs F. Urburu, S. B. Hale & Co., F. Seaber, J. Chilis y Bujarao and E. Bunge, to carry out this colossal scheme.

The country is going through a period of railway fever. The Great Southern Railway Co. are stretching their steel hands towards Bahia Blanca and Tandil; the Western Railway is branching off towards San Nicolas, Saladillo, La Plata, etc.; the Transandine Railway is advancing from Mercedes to Villa Mercedes; the Andine Railway is being pushed ahead with feverish activity towards Mendoza and San Juan; the Trancauana line is advancing to Juuyu and Salta; the Casado line is connecting the South-West of Santa Fe with Rosario; the Entre Ríos line and the Eastern Argentinean railway will probably also extend. In fact the country has arrived at the climax of a railway era, the result of which will immensely benefit the great natural resources at present lying idle owing to difficult means of communication.

This new scheme of an Andine Railway from Bahia Blanca staggers one; its conception is grand and reflects much credit on the buoyant hopes of the promoters of the scheme. The proposed line is to start from the town of Bahia Blanca, turn gradually to the South, skirt the head of the river Colorado, pass same near the foot of the Andes, meet the Neuquén, an affluent of the Rio Negro, and enter the most desolate country thereabouts on route through the lately discovered passes to its natural terminus, in Chile.

The gauge of the line, it is supposed, will be one meter, and the cost per kilometer \$13,000. There is one jarring circumstance in the scheme—a guarantee of 7 o'clock is requested

from the National Government. The company also request large land grants along the line for the purpose of planting colonies, a very laudable intention indeed. We do not doubt for one moment that the new line will be carried out if the Government grants the guarantee requested.

The hand of this country is want of water and of easy means of communication. Some attempt is being made at present to irrigate the Rio Negro valley, and competent military authorities assert that the irrigation of the Mesopotamia between the rivers Negro and Colorado is quite as easy. The waters of the Colorado and Rio Negro can be easily turned into this Southern Entro Ríos, the waters would flow into the low lands and form natural channels. The irrigation of that part of the country, in fact, is more important than the construction of the railway.

If both could be carried out in conjunction, the immense barren territory between Bahia Blanca and the Andes would be opened to the industry of settlers.

The camps at the mouth of the Colorado are the finest in this province perhaps, and the gauchos of the South state that no better fattening camp could be found in the inside pastures.

The fact is not unknown and many thousands of cattle have already been sent to the fertile banks of the river; but outside the valley and the "rincónes" formed by the river, the camps are dry and barren and no stock could be attempted before water is sup-

pplied. The proposed railway may appear some years before its time, but it will hasten the colonization of all the South and change the face of the country; or buyer than the charge for the advertisement, the amount overdued, and interest on same.

Art. 9.—The sale by auction of a debtor's property cannot be interfered with by either the National or Provincial Courts, except in case of a claim of ownership; nor can said Courts grant the debtor an extension of time, not prevent the Mortgage Office receiving the amount due to it at the moment.

Art. 10.—When a property in arrears is sold, if there be any balance over what the debtor owes, it shall be handed to him first deducting the interest and expenses. Should the price obtained for the property be insufficient to cover the loan, interest, commission and expenses, the Mortgage Credit Office can attach any other real estate of the debtor that is free from lien, or any part of it that may be free from same, or, in default of his having such estate, or that its value is insufficient to meet the debt, proceedings can be taken against the debtor personally for the deficit, the Court being bound to accept and act on the claim presented by the Mortgage Credit Office when the Royal Decree authorizes the same.

Art. 11.—A debtor can redeem all or part of his debt, either in money or in Cédulas.

In the first case, the Cédulas delivered shall be cancelled. In both cases, the quarterly payment in advance, becoming due shall be retained by the Mortgage Office.

Art. 12.—Properties mortgaged under this Act can be transferred to a new owner, by previously advising the Board or the managers of the branches and bearing the seal of the Mortgage Credit Office.

Art. 13.—A debtor can redeem all or part of his debt, either in money or in Cédulas.

In the first case, the Cédulas delivered shall be cancelled. In both cases, the quarterly payment in advance, becoming due shall be retained by the Mortgage Office.

Art. 14.—Properties mortgaged under this Act can be transferred to a new owner, by previously advising the Board or the managers of the branches and bearing the seal of the Mortgage Credit Office.

Art. 15.—Contracts of mortgages for all this Act shall be exempt from the ten years' limitation on mortgages established in Art. 90, Cap. VII, Lit. XIV, Lib. III. See II of the Civil Code.

Art. 16.—Those who ask for a loan from the Mortgage Office shall be put to no further expense in acquiring it than 5 or 10 National dollars for the examination of the title by a lawyer and the certificate of the Registrar General of Mortgages and Deeds.

The contract between the borrower and the Mortgage Office shall be drawn up and signed in a Special Register to be kept by the President of the Board in the Capitol and the manager of the branches, in the same form as the Judicial records of the public notaries, to be signed by the respective secretaries and sealed with the Seal of the Mortgage Office. A duplicate copy of the Register shall be given to Codiciles, to be filed with the Mortgage Office, and shall be valid for all legal purposes, as a written deed, although the Court may order it to be compared with the Register by the Attorney. The duplicate and the original contract shall be drawn up on un-stamped paper and be signed by the parties to the application for the loan.

Art. 17.—The 1 per cent annual commission, the interest on overdue instalments and the quarter in advance which the Bank retains in case of the part or full payment of the loan shall form the Reserve Fund of the Mortgage Office, first deducting the expenses and salaries of the extra clerks which the Bank will have to employ in the Capital for the Mortgage Office. After the first five years, only one-fourth of these receipts shall be added to the Reserve, and the other three-fourths shall be divided between the National Bank and the National Treasury.

Art. 18.—The Executive shall draw up the regulations in connection with this Act, as also the Statutes of the Mortgage Office and arrange with the National Bank Directors for affiliating it with their administration; and it shall also determine the cost of administration in accord with the Board, and report everything to Congress in the first fortnight of next session.

Art. 19.—Only the National Courts in the Capital and the Sessions in the Provinces, shall have jurisdiction in cases of mortgages effected under this Act.

Art. 20.—The Executive is authorized to lend the Mortgage Credit Office sum equivalent to the amortization paid by its debtors, calling on sellers of Codiciles to tender same; but when the price of these at home or abroad, or at over or par, the Mortgage Credit Office shall have the right to pay the Codiciles to be amortized, and which shall carry no interest from the day named for payment.

Art. 21.—Let this be communicated etc.
