The Ateneo de Uruguay met with a brilliant success at the "fiesta literaria". The concourse of people was immense and the greatest interest was evinced by the public in the reading of the various literary compositions.

In political circles news is scarce for the present. Deputy Lamas affair has already faded into oblivion, and has caused to excite further interest.

THE "CURSO FORZOSO" DEBATE.

Yesterday all this important question came up again before the Deputies and gave rise to a most animated debate. The opposition made every effort to send it back to committee, but the Chamber by a large majority insisted on at once despatching it.

Article 3 was put to the vote, whether the Chamber insist or not on it, as passed by the Deputies.

Sr. Cairo made a strong speech against the bill which he considered would enable the Government to start many "curso forzoso" banks in the Provinces as it thought proper. He showed that all the present "curso forzoso" banks were differently situated, none were alike. Art. 1, of this law, is badly and vaguely drawn up. He was in favor of Banks in all the Provinces, not 5, but 50; but he wished to see them properly constituted, and not as by this law, without any guarantee and creating an anarchy of paper money in the Provinces.

Mr. Funes replied and showed that Art. 1 had been already passed by both houses, and could not now be discussed; as for the Government, we all knew the Government was in favor, since it was the Government itself that created Article 1. After some desultory discussion the President put Art. 3 to the vote. 67 members present, and requiring 2/3, 44 votes to insist on its passing, and now Art. 3 stands as passed by the Senate, which excludes the Entre Ríos Bank.

Art. 4 was next read, as passed by the Senate. Mr. Funes made a brilliant speech, interspersed with the most amusing remarks which provoked roars of laughter. He said Truth always prevails. The Senate had gone and put its foot in it, by excluding "oro sellado" from the exception; but gold is gold in excepted. He would ask the Judges what they called "oro sellado". Every Judge in the country would look to the intention of the parties and contracts in "oro sellado"; everyone, save the Senators, knew well what it meant: special gold contracts. Again he would remind the House that a new emission was in fact a new tax, and the authorities decided so. Well, all taxes must be initiated in the Deputies; therefore this new tax, now emission, new "curso forzoso" law could not begin in the Senate, but in the Deputies, and so the courts will decide. It was all best to say "oro sellado" from the exception; but gold is gold in excepted.




