EDITOR'S TABLE

Early rising and noise are both signs of defective civilization. Nervous diseases are greatly on the increase in Buenos Ayres, owing to the unceasing noise morning, noon and night. Vehicles make a more ferocious noise in this city than in any other on the globe, thanks to the boulders the Lord Mayor has laid for paving stones. Fifteen years ago, when small rocks were in fashion as pavement, the noise was not so great. The street-vendors here are also more numerous and yell louder than in any other country. Then we have the ridiculous and utterly useless trash, and of late the ice-men have got big brass horns on which they toutselfs. Soon every fellow that sells even a pair of shoe-strings in the streets will provide himself with a horn. It is really both monstrous and absurd that there is no regulation for street-crying. The sleeping citizens should not be awakened at 5 a.m. by urchins yelling over lottery tickets, or burly costermongers with ice-carts blowing away on horns.

The Rosario papers literally teem with accidents and offences: Two sisters nearly tear each other to ribbons for the same "novio"; A citizen smashes another citizen's head with a beer bottle; A policeman cuts down another "cuidadano" with his sword because he did not invite him to a wedding at his house: Two men beat their wives: Another wretch beats his aged mother. Is there no criminal Judge up there and where are the Police?

President Roa's reception at his private house on Friday night had very little of the setting sun about it. Never before was there a larger crowd of friends and officials of State in the President's house. It was midnight when the last visitors departed.

Another fall at the Government. All the National railways will carry free any and all kinds of things that may be intended for the truly Royal Society's Exhibition next year. What about the unfortunate shareholders of the Continental Exhibition, what a shame that business?

We bear from a most competent critic that the play "El Duello," at the Politeama, is the most disgusting rubbish he ever had the misfortune to sit to the bitter end.

The new Maldonado bridge, ordered a year ago, is still in the tender stage.

The Press, the best informed and most reliable paper in town when abuses have to be tackled, says the Naval School in Callao Largo is going to the dogs; and all kinds of backstairs influence is being used to frustrate President Roa's wish to save the school by sending it out of B. Ayres. From what has been published of late, it is quite clear that neither the Naval nor the Military school is up to the mark.

The Colon Theatre was crammed to the doors on Friday night at the opening of the French Kermesse. The show of articles is splendid. The only drawback is that the orchestra is a little weak indeed.

Bass van Castel, the swindler, has left behind him another victim as well as Mr. Zeballos; Mr. Serra, who got stuck for a round 1000 pesos. We have never yet seen "dumb" by a swindler. The tribe, somehow, are afraid of editors.

Here, are some figures for Friend Marichale and his brother Bonifaces, to make their mouths water like the rams of Apis:—During the season of one hundred days one Saratoga hotel paid a market bill of \$125,000. Among the items were 90,000 pounds of beef, 16,000 pounds mutton, 20,000 pounds of lamb, 7,000 pounds of veal, 1,500 pounds of pork, 60,000 pounds of chicken, 35,000 pounds of game, 900 dozen squares, 26,000 pounds of fish, 6,000 pounds of salmon, 22,000 pounds of butter, 24,000 dozen eggs, 65,000 quarts of milk and 10,000 quarts of cream.
