Advises from Burmah announce the rising of the Shan States against King Theebaw, and the burning of several villages by the insurgents.

The left bank of the River Salween has been abandoned by the Shans, who have put the Burmese to flight.

London 22nd.—Orders have been re-

ceived at Woolwich for one million of cartridges and 100,000 rifles for the expedition against King Theebaw.

London 21st.—The Jury have decided that there is cause for a trial of the editor-in-chief of the P. M. Gazette.

Copenhagen 21st.—The King has is-

sued orders for the immediate strength-

ening of the garrison. It is thought

that the city will be declared in a state

of siege and that a revolution will

break out if the King refuses to grant

the concessions demanded by Parlia-

ment.

Copenhagen 22nd.—A young printer

of the name of Rasmussen, fired two

shots from a revolver this evening at

the Premier, and was preparing to

fire a third when he was seized by two

police agents. The first ball hit one of

the buttons of the Premier's coat and

happily gapped off. The second shot

went wide of the mark. Rasmussen

declares that he was led to take this

step in consequence of M. Estruy's injurious policy for the country.

Constantinople 21st.—The Anglo-Turkish agreement has been favorably received by the powers.

Moscow 22nd.—A fire broke out this morning destroying a large portion of the town. Many people have been killed and wounded.

New York 22nd.—The house Morton C. Warren has failed for \$106,116.

Paris 22nd.—Last night a soirée was given in honor of Prince Waldemar.

Over 1,500 persons were present.

The marriage gifts received by the Prince and by Princess Marie d'Orléans, were exhibited. Queen Victoria sent a beautiful brooch encrusted with immovable diamonds.

Rosario 23rd.—Advices from Santa Fe state that Zavala will stand as candidate to the Governorship. Such a step has caused great surprise, as it is directly in opposition to the interest of the party.

Advices from the camps are most satisfactory; shearing has commenced and the weather is fine.

Montevideo 23d.—The *Rey* publishes a most vehement article against the present Government.

The *Siglo* states that, in view of the astounding disclosures of Molton Gonzalez, M. Amaro Carreto must publicly refute all accusations.

The Malonado Port will be com-

menced on the 1st of November.

The bathing season will not be opened in the Plaza Ramírez before December, owing to the improvements which are being carried out.

The death is announced of Madame Carolina Oliva, a well known artist, and member of the Italian Association "Aspirazioni Drammatiche."
