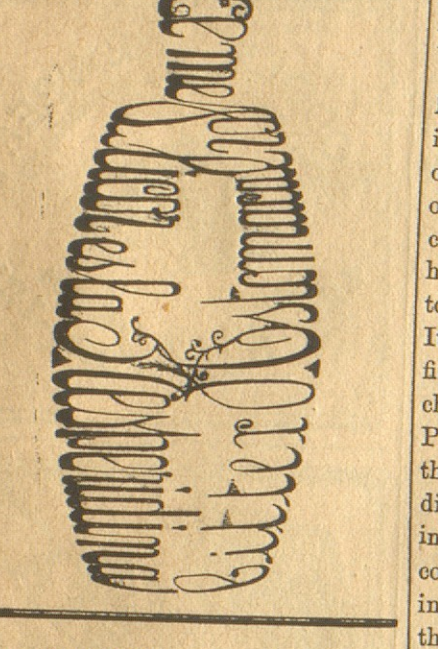

Paris, 31st.—Cholera has broken out in the Spanish provinces in the Bay of Biscay. During the week 200 cases, of which 45 proved fatal, occurred in Laredo (Santander).

London 31st.—The Post Master General was to deliver a speech last night at Lathom. When he rose, he was interrupted by the vociferations of his audience and the confusion that ensued resulted in many being seriously bruised and hurt.

THE ARREST OF THE EDITORS.

Progress! Montevideoan progress! What crimes are committed in thy name? Six Montevideoan editors arrested; six redactors in prison, torn from their homes, their families, their printing-offices and their subscribers.

Better far for Montevideo that the remnant of her population as it is; that all the 'catboats' vessels in the port, than that the greatest bulwark of a people's liberties—Freedom of the Press—should be swept away by one of the most tyrannical acts ever recorded in a free and constitutional country.

There is a certain want of ballast, or there are common sons in Montevideoan circles which weigh everything to the most violent extremes. Witness the unmeaning row a couple of months ago against the poor ones, who in their own line did more good than the whole pack of Oriental politicians that figure in the Budget.

Such an editorial ecstasism is unprecedented in the history of the Uruguay or any other country; yet these Redactors if they had any brains or could see farther than their noses, might have known that the case of the poor ones would be their own before many weeks were about.

Since the return of General Santos yesterday evening, from the Colorado Hills, the extradition of Dr. Zorrilla de San Martin occupies the whole attention of the Government. This gentleman is on board the Brazilian gunboat, Imperial Marcheseo, Longly gumbats have been sent to the Oriental Minister in Rio de Janeiro to immediately urge the delivery of the prisoner.

Condoled not with our imprisoned colleagues but with the blundering president of the Banda Oriental, who has again perpetrated one of those gross political errors, which sooner or later entail merited retribution.

Commencing on the situation, the Siglo observes: The appellation of traitor is now meant to design an ex- secretary of Legation, who made known to the public the secret of a most advantageous contract for the country, and the papers which have taken the liberty to discuss the merits of such a contract.

At the re-opening of the Eastern question has had no good result, in calming the agitation between Spain and Germany about the Caroline Islands, the title to which is left for His Holiness Leo XIII. to decide. All the London papers make complimentary allusion to the Pope in reference to this arbitration, but the Italian papers are not pleased, because it seems to give the Vatican a higher position than the Government of King Humbert. However, it will be a very desirable result if the matter be decided amicably, for at one time it looked as if King Alfonso would have had to choose between declaring war or abdicating.

At the close of last night, which I send you, is a list of candidates for the coming elections. As the time approaches, the conviction grows that Gladstone and Chamberlain will come in again with a sweeping majority of 100. They say it will be the first anticipatory change. Mr. Spurgeon says, "corruption is in the Palace," and this encourages the Socialists, who had a meeting, 30,000 strong, last Sunday, with Phrygian caps, Marsellaise and other outward marks. We are in a bad way at present. On one hand, Conservative idiots rave about taxes on grain; on the other a band of Radicals, who will pull down whatever checks their career.

Meantime, the wealth of the country increases hourly. The Income Tax assessments have risen from 575 millions in 1880 to 612 millions in 1884, an increase of 34 millions of income, which would warrant the conclusion that capital wealth has increased 500 or 600 millions in 4 years. Moreover, during the 10 years, ending 1880, the increase of wealth averaged 150 million per annum. At the same time the condition of the working classes is appalling. Those charitable ladies, who are the poor, not merely men but ladies in the world, assure us that eight or ten persons, often of different families, were to be found living in a small room, almost destitute of clothing or furniture.

Today begins the system of six-penny telegrams, which will prove a great advantage to the public: 300 extra clerks have been employed in London alone. There is a great demand for to-day's Contemporary Review, the first article being by Cardinal Newman, "The Moral and Political Position of the Pope," and another attractive writer of the age, "according to Mr. Gladstone."

There is an idea here that Farquharson (the absent cashier of the Munster Bank) has safely reached some part of South America with his booty, which is said to be about £20,000. It seems that he had for years been putting it by, and the Directors had not the slightest suspicion.

Stuart Bill, the Queensland Premier, has been appointed to the board of the Agent-General for Queensland in London, caused by the death of Mr. Elder.

The Equateur's Mails.

London, 4th Oct. Dean Reichel was on Tuesday deposed at St. Patrick's Cathedral, Dublin, Bishop of Meath in succession to Lord Plunket.

The Royal Commission on Trade Depression will hold its first meeting since the prorogation of Parliament on Wednesday next.

As the German corvette Augusta has not been heard of since she left Palermo four months ago, the Berlin Government has come to the conclusion that she and the whole of her crew are lost.

The Madrid correspondent of the Times telegraphed yesterday:—The principal foreign correspondents in this capital who have transmitted to their respective newspapers facts and comments as to what is passing in Spain at the present moment are: there are good grounds for believing, that there is a real explosion from Spanish territory in the next 24 hours. It is alleged that the question is debated at the Council now being held at the Presidency, the Premier, Antonio Cánovas del Castillo, presiding. In the hope that the decision to be taken by the Council will be such as to avoid the perpetration of an act from which the Government and the country will be the greatest sufferers, I refrain from making comments of any kind.

A report was given by Whydah when the mail steamer Elmina left there on the 8th ult. that the Portuguese Government had bought 1,200 slaves of the King of Dahomey to be sent to the island of St. Thome to work on the coffee plantations.

The Government Bill for the gradual abolition of slavery has passed both Houses of the Brazilian Parliament. The Madras Municipality has extended the suffrage to women. Disastrous floods in Bengal and Assam are reported in telegrams from Calcutta and Inspruck.

IMPENDING EUROPEAN WAR.

The following are the latest advices received per Equateur:—Constantinople, Oct. 3rd. The representatives of the Great Powers met yesterday at the Italian Embassy, to discuss the situation arising out of the revolution in Eastern Roumelia and the union of that province to Bulgaria. Count Corti being the doyen of the diplomatic corps, the duty of presiding at the Conference naturally falls on him. The meeting lasted a very short time, because on Saturday last requesting his colleagues to be seated, Baron de Calice, the Austro-Hungarian representative, declared that his instructions were not complete. The French Ambassador, the Marquis de Noailles, expressed the hope that all the representatives would receive immediate instructions, as the situation was so serious a character as not to allow time to be wasted. I had a long conversation last night with one of the Ambassadors, who expressed himself in the following terms on the situation:—"If a Conference is to do anything, the first thing to be done is to take guarantee that the decision of the Powers shall be respected. It sounds simply absurd that all the Great Powers of Europe should assemble to discuss the basis of a treaty, that a solemn pact should be signed, and that the moment a few thousand persons rise to violate a treaty, the whole of Europe should appear impotent to interfere. The present situation would not have arisen if the Signatory Powers of the Berlin Treaty had made proper provisions for enforcing the execution of the treaty in the event of violations, which, considering the state of the Balkan Peninsula, might easily have been contemplated. If the duty and the right to enforce the execution of the treaty devolved on the Porte, Turkey should have been placed in the position to carry out her obligations. If the Porte has not fulfilled all the conditions imposed by the Berlin Treaty, she has likewise failed in carrying out such provisions as the execution of fortifications in Eastern Roumelia, which were designed for her benefit. It now appears a very clear thing that the Porte had not the means to assert at once—by a military demonstration—her rights in Eastern Roumelia. This situation reveals the real cause of Turkey's hesitation with regard to her despatch at once a few thousand men to Eastern Roumelia without compromising the security of other provinces and of the capital itself by wakening the garrisons, how can she be expected to send thousands of men to Egypt, who she is naturally anxious to lose no further time in coming to an understanding with Great Britain. This explains the anxiety exhibited at the Porte when the report was spread that Sir H. D. Wolff was about to leave Constantinople.

But to return to the present meeting of Ambassadors. If our labours are to pay the way for revision of the Berlin Treaty, it must be taken to the new arrangement. Either the Powers must combine in joint action in the event of one of the minor States violating the treaty, or the Porte must be placed in a position to enforce the decisions of the Great Powers.

I understand that M. de Nelidoff expressed considerable surprise on learning that the Sultan had personally intended to visit Constantinople at the present moment. If de Nelidoff is more than ever convinced that the object of Sir H. D. Wolff's mission was to conclude an alliance with Turkey, I am informed that in the course of a communication between M. de Nelidoff and Said Pasha the latter exhibited great resolution in rejecting the suggestions of Russia to appeal at once to arms.

A telegram from Vienna says:—"A circular from the Porte, dated September 26, protests against the disarming of the Macedonian colony."

The following is a list of the Ambassadors now at Constantinople representing their various Governments at the meetings which are being held on the Macedonian question:—England, Sir W. White; Italy, Count Corti; Russia, M. Nelidoff; France, Marquis de Noailles; Austria, Baron de Calice; and Germany, M. de Badowitz. Sir Edward Thornton, the new British Ambassador to Turkey, who left England some days ago for St. Petersburg, is now on his way to take up office at Constantinople. Sir W. White will remain at the British Embassy some time after his arrival, in order to give Sir Edward Thornton the benefit of experience on pending questions.

The Macedonian colony is organizing a legion of volunteers. The number of young men enrolling is increasing. The inhabitants of Crete are being called upon to enroll with Greece, if the status quo is not maintained. The Chamber is called for the 17th inst. The Government has issued orders for the purchase of a considerable number of horses. Petitions reach the King from all parts of the country calling on His Majesty to pursue a vigorous policy.

PARIS LETTER.

September 25th. The army manoeuvres at Arras and Amiens passed off very satisfactorily; the infantry and artillery were especially effective, and displayed careful training. A long-felt want of the deficient supply of instructors. In lodging and dining the delegates of foreign powers, excepting those of the French, German and Spanish officers from coming too closely together. Turkey, acted as a buffer between the English and Russians, and seemed to be happy with either, were but "other dear chamber-aw."

The approximate census of the population of France for 1884 is published. It shows a net increase of 79,000 in 1874 the net annual augmentation was 173,000. The insignificant census of 1881 gave a population for the entire country of 37,672,408; the annual increase in 1882 was 97,000; for 1884, as above. What a falling off is there my countrymen! The important conclusions to draw from the tables are: augmentation in the number of deaths; increase of illegitimate births; decrease in the number of marriages. The authorities finding their profits to increase and multiply proving of no avail, and the well-to-do classes resolving to have no more than two olive branches, now employ their energies to a reduction in the infantile death-rate. This is all very good; but it might also do something for adult-life security, by sanitary reforms. Everything, almost, remains to be done in the way of town draining. The oldest inhabitants cannot recall a season when the sewers of Paris were more offensive than the present; the openings of the drains, and that in the most aristocratic quarters, give out whiffs of stenches of the two and sevenfold Cologne standard, like a blast furnace.

But strange, quite an army of laborers is daily employed in the city drains; at certain stations you can see the men entering on, and leaving off, work: they are between twenty and sixty years of age, and all robust, healthy men. I asked some of them, "how they could live here, and were they never sick?" they laughed, and replied: "they were never sick, and did not mind the odors." The army of men employed in the night-soil removal duties, is a picture of health itself, and none of the men ever down with fever, and have never had cholera.

How do scientists explain these facts? Professor Brevelle, of the Law School of Paris, has been exceedingly judiciously and correctly in the new law, and stands the scoundrels abroad is only another name for executing him. Certain death in an unhealthy climate, for men worn out by vice, is more cruel than the guillotine. He winds up his exhaustive dissertation on the whole question thus: "Study the experience of England, and which is that of all rational countries not possessed of sufficient intelligence to say—'keep the home acclamations at home; do not shoot it."
