The numerous friends of the V. Rev. Father Eddis will be glad to hear that the General of his order has refused his request to be permitted to resign his post of Prior, but consented to give him a few months' vacation by way of rest. He assured the General that he did not wish to leave Buenos Ayres, but to be permitted to continue there as one of the Fathers under whatever Prior might be named to succeed him. He left London in the last week of Sept. for Westminster, Ireland, and expects to reach Buenos Ayres about Christmas.

Things appear to be getting most uncomfortably calorific for the titled class in England. The other day the Marquis of Lorne had to cut and run from the mob, and now poor old nobility' Manner, the Post Master General, has been treated in the same unmanly fashion. This sort of thing is calculated to inspire some serious misgivings as to how the new franchise is going to work. One thing is highly probable—Chamberlain as Prime Minister before much time is about.

Amongst the seventy thieves that were raised by the police the other day and who are now in the Policia, a Hungarian duke in the swindling line, and Granger the dog-man. Poverty makes people acquainted with strange bedfellows. How poor Granger fell among thieves is not stated.

The question of the poor Indians is now the great one in all circles. The brutal shooting of 200 of the poor indefensible savages in the Chaco has raised a storm of indignation; but the public have full confidence in the promise of the Minister of War to punish the guilty officers. 


