LEROUY RE-ELECTED.

BRITISH AND GERMAN PRESS-SPARING.

CYCONE IN THE STATES.

Paris, 10th.—M. Leroy has been re-elected President of the Senate. M. Meilhan opened the session to-day thanking the Deputies for the distinction conferred upon him, and hoping that in spite of the efforts of a certain political fraction the Parliament would triumph as the true expression of the will of the majority.

Berlin, 10th.—The polemics between English and German papers on Sir R. D. Maunder's participation in the events of 1870-71 have been suspended.

New York, 11th.—A cyclone has swept over the center and West of the Union, many victims and heavy losses.

Roma, 11th.—The opening of Parliament has been postponed from the 15th to the 28th inst.

BOULANGISTS TURN JACQUES INTO RIDICULE.

BISMARCK AND THE AFRICAN QUESTION.

THE AMERICAN SENATE IN SECRET SITTING.

THE ROYAL PALACE IN MADRID "DYNAMIC."

BISMARCK VERY ILL.

Paris, 8th.—All the Boulangist organs qualify the choice of M. Jacque to oppose General Boulanger as ridiculous. They say he is not the man for such an emergency.

In an interview with General Boulanger, the Spanish Minister, recently returned from the Seine department, stated that, although Mr. (Montaner) was considered a royalist, his political tendencies were those of the Boulangist party. He added that the victory at the supplementary elections was a guarantee of General Boulanger's return to power.

Berlin, 8th.—It is stated that Prince Bismarck will take part in the debate in the Reichstag on German affairs on the Eastern Coast of Africa. There is a rumor of fresh naval reinforcements being sent to Zanzibar.

Washington, 8th.—After the reading of the report, sent into the Senate by the Committee of Foreign Affairs, on the resumption of the works of the Panama Canal, Senator Gray rose to make a speech in which he declared that the work had been well done by the contractors, and that the Government should give them a large sum of money for their services.

Senate Edwards who moved that the sum of \$100,000 be voted to the contractors.
