RIVER PLATE BANKING

London, Dec. 12th.

Two of the most brilliant banking-sheets that have been published this year in London are those of the London and River Plate Bank and the English Bank of the River Plate, giving dividends respectively of 15 and 10 per cent to the fortunate shareholders.

The profits of the banks of the river just closed would have been double in both cases almost double those dividends, but the Boards of Directors wisely set aside large sums for their reserve funds. Mr. Drabble's speech yesterday gave a complete picture of the extraordinary resources of the Argentine Republic, and the Hon. Caryngham's address on Monday to the English Bank of the River Plate shareholders was quite in keeping. Coming as it was the two reports have done, within an interval of 48 hours the effect which they produce on the public mind is most favorable to the interests of Buenos Ayres.
