

ARCHBISHOP CORRIGAN PROTESTS.

URGENT'S VOICE FOR PEACE.

Dublin, 6.—O'Brien's health is so bad that he has been sent to the prison infirmary.

Paris, 6.—The Chamber of Deputies has confirmed the election of General Cleuseret for War Department. It was thought that, owing to his being American born, he was ineligible.

Father Hyacinth says that he has no Boulanger tendency. He places the general on a par with the late General Soulonge of Haiti.

London, 6.—At the Requet Mass today, the report of Prince Randolph's son, the Prince of Wales, Lord Salisbury, and the French, German, Turkish and Belgian Ambassadors were present.

Paris, 6.—The Figaro states that the doctors at the Pasteur Institute have discovered the diphtheria microbe, and they hope to be able to prevent the disease by inoculation.

Rome, 6.—The Observator Romano states that the Vatican has received a telegram from Archibishop Corriani, of New York, who protests in contributing to the Parnell Fund had no intention of criticising the policy of the Government.

Deputy Cavallote, of the extreme left, attacked to-day the foreign policy of the Government. In the course of his speech he said that the Government was endeavouring to preserve peace by formidable armaments rather than by founding friendly feelings.

Art. 4.—Guaranteed companies shall reserve at least 20 per cent. of their capital for subscription in the Republic.

Art. 6.—They shall be likewise bound to have at least 20 per cent. of their capital in the country and hold a recognized social, commercial, or industrial position.

3rd.—To establish their legal domicile in the Republic.

4th.—To furnish the Executive with all the data and information it may ask for, and in conformity with whatever rules may be established for the better enforcement of this Law.

Art. 7.—The Executive shall determine, when drawing up said rules, and according to the nature of all branches of the business, such as banking, insurance, hotel, tailoring, Extract, and all other cases whatsoever to which the guarantee of each company pertains.

Art. 8.—The calculation of the profits for the purpose of guarantees shall include the amount of all branches of the business, such as banking, insurance, hotel, tailoring, Extract, and all other cases whatsoever to which the guarantee of each company pertains.

Art. 11.—Should the lessee sustained by a company affect its capital, Government shall be entitled to demand payment of the amount of the guaranteed capital of each company.

Art. 12.—The Executive shall determine, when drawing up said rules, and according to the circumstances and the general state of the industry on which the guarantee is given, the minimum weight of guarantee that must be given to each company.

Art. 13.—To keep their books and accounts in Spanish.

Art. 14.—Guaranteed companies shall be liable to pay the expenses of safety and health that may be enacted by the competent authorities.

Art. 15.—In the contracts shall be set forth the annual amount of the gross receipts to be written off for wear and tear of the working plant, in accord with those scientific and commercial rules generally accepted in the master.

If the applications for guarantee exceed the amount assigned by law to the respective district, such applications shall be considered by order of date, and no attention shall be paid to those applications not drawn up in accordance with Art. 2.

Art. 4.—In the case of several applications being presented from one district, preference shall be given to the most important of that district. The Procurador General shall be consulted on this subject, and also the Royal Society.

Art. 5.—The decision in the case shall be published in a newspaper in the city, so that the decision be favorable, the company within six days shall deposit in the National Bank \$5,000 gold as guarantee of good faith, and five months shall be allowed to present plans, etc.

Art. 6.—The decree amending all contracts shall be published in a newspaper in the city, in order that the companies whose applications have been thrown out may have an opportunity of applying a second time for the guarantee. The applications shall be considered and a decision shall be given under the conditions already stipulated, preference being given for 20 days to those companies whose former applications have been rejected.

Art. 7.—The contract, independently of the conditions mentioned in Art. 2, must specify:

1.—The time required for the opening of the establishment.

2.—The minimum quantity in kilograms of beef which the company proposes exporting per annum, under penalty of forfeiting the guarantee.

Art. 8.—For the purpose of the guarantees, the companies shall present every quarter a detailed account of their capital, paid-up, if any, and all this must be set forth in the deed of agreement between the State and the company.
