ANOTHER REBELL IN UGANDA.

DUBLIN, 26.—Count Apponyi and Herr
Hornig on the part of the opposition
of the Lower House of Hungarian Parliament
are not cordially supporting the
policy of the Government, as was stated by foreign organs of
the Press. Herr von Tisza expresses his great
confidence in the policy of the opposition,
adding that he did not believe in the
Alliance to be so ephemeral as to be
injured by such reports. These remarks
of Herr von Tisza, referring to the success
of consolidation of Hungary as a State, said
that it materially strengthened the politi-
cal and financial credit of the
country. The Governmental majority law
was passed by sweeping majorities.

Sir Peirson, 26.—The New Venetian
ambassador, continuing on the
homeward-bound Sagitteo, says the
Attilioff expedition by French
cavalry, express themselves deeply indi-
cating at the shedding of Russian blood by
such extreme action was unnecessary. The
Gracchus, commenting on the same
Brienne, affirms originally to the Franco-
Prussian war, that it is known
from good sources that the main cause of
the Altimoff expedition will be taken as
a protest of war to Odessa. See Report
of the subject in the *Gazeta Naval Oficial* &
Comandante, and previous report in
these columns, according to which various
have been received that are unfavorable to Attilioff.

Alexander, 26.—Capt. Wissman
has been born and will proceed to Cairo,
where he will remain for a number of
months to accompany the British
expedition to Egypt. He is known
to have been born in 1840, and
will have been twenty-four years old
when he arrives, two of their number being
selected by the King himself.

THE IRISH IMMIGRANTS.

The ordinary meeting of the Committee
opened yesterday at 3 p.m., Mr. Drysdale
in the chair. The Secretary read a letter
from Mr. Abbott of the Great Southern
Railway, explaining that in consequence of
the recent general strike the port of
Montevideo had been closed, and
it was found impossible to forward the
Irish settlers yesterday evening. Dr. Don
Quinto Costa, Minister of Foreign Affairs,
came to change ideas with the
Committee in the hope that the joint
action would be productive of the best
results to the British residents and the
nation at large. His Excellency stated
that the Government was resolved to furnish
Immigration by every fair means, but
some care should be observed in the selec-
tion which unfortunately seems not to have
been done in the present instance. The
agent in Cork is not to have power
distributed any more free passages and should
the fact of this having collected fees im-
mediately disown it. As an instance of
what could be done in the world he
had mentioned the case of Mr. Dineen, regarding arrangements
for the accommodation of future arrivals.
Dr. Quinto Costa stated that his Govern-
ment would gladly pay the rent of a house
or barracks close to town, where families
could apply for servants or farm laborers;
those choosing to form the colony at Bahia
Blanca to be forwarded either by train or
by water without delay or expense of any
kind. Mr. Murphy reported all well at
the galop in Plaza Constitución, the
people in great spirits; the prospect of their
early departure for this camp; all the
agents sent to Mr. Leary, and the other
Irish families have been packed by
Mr. Grimes, who is on the ground. The
meeting was adjourned until Thursday
week when Mr. Garfield and the Secretary,
Mr. F. H. Mallard, will have re-
turned from the new colony. The physi-
cians in attendance to-day were Drs
Thomas and Kough also Mr. Duke. The
health of the immigrants was reported
favorably.

The following letters were read:

Feb. 29th 1889.
Mr. Frank Marshall Esq.

Present.

Dear Sir,

I beg to advise you that Mr. Abbott
called on me to say that owing to the
cost of requiring all his carriage, he will
not be able to supply those required for
the Irish immigrants until to-morrow
night.

I have seen Minister Quinto Costa, who
promised to attend our meeting to-day at
3 p.m. and will then give explanations
and encourage news respecting future
arrivals of immigrants.

Kindly advise Mr. Sundland that the
immigrants will only leave to-morrow
night and beg him to provide the necessary
provisions for them.
