TELEGRAMS
(via Galesburg.)

Berlin, 23rd.—The question of German emigration is again the front. A Bill will be presented to the Reichstag obliging all emigrants from the country to give one month's notice to the police before they start on their journey. The Emperor is much interested in the matter and wishes to push through the Bill.

Paris, 23rd.—The Boulangist Deputy has summoned before the Court of the Seine M. Constant, owing to an incident in the House of Deputies on the 19th ult.

Madrid, 23rd.—Another terrible storm has caused great damage all over Spain. A train derailed at Tolosa, killing the guard and injuring several passengers.

St. Petersburg, 23rd.—The investigation committee appointed to sift the adulteration of flour has asked for the arrangement of Wallosky and Neiman as implicated in the adulteration.

Xeres, 23rd.—The authorities have seized in the houses of Anarchists 54 rifles and 1000 cartridges.

New York, 23rd.—Two hundred Lithuanian colonists from the Russian vessel Louisiana arrived and set fire to her. Captain Boyd and his wife, in close embrace, threw themselves into the sea and caught hold of a burning plank. Eighteen of the crew were drowned.

London, 23rd.—News of further wreckage on the coast have been received. A French vessel foundered off Scilly Islands, and three of the crew were drowned.

Berlin, 23rd.—The annual banking report has appeared, announcing unexpected success.

St. Petersburg, 23rd.—The court-martial has just condemned student Kotschinsk to be hanged, for attempting to assassinate Polakoff, Governor of Krasnodar.

London, 23rd.—Sir Henry Isaac, Joseph Isaac and Horace Botolph, charged with defrauding the Hansard Publishing Union of £30,000, will be prosecuted for the offence. Sir Henry Isaac was once Lord Mayor of London.

Bombay, 23rd.—Smallpox has broken out violently here. There are many sick, and 23 persons died of the disease last week.

London, 23rd.—An explosion of fire-damp in a South Wales coal mine has killed several miners and injured others.

One of the most difficult things in the world is to dispose of depreciated stocks, and the means adopted for this purpose are often most ingenious. We have already alluded to the triangular arrangement between Messrs. Baring, Mr. Milner and the Argentine Government, the main purpose whereof was to induce the British public to buy up the Argentine securities held by the Baring, the effect of which will be to give the Argentine Government a loan of £2,500,000 upon which there is a loss of "present quotations of £114,000 sterling."

We have every reason to expect still greater losses on the stocks held by the Baring. Owing to the mystery which has surrounded Mr. Milner's arrangement we are ignorant of the exact values at which they were taken over, except as regards United Uruguayans, which he says were taken at 50, and which are now at 85. It may be interesting here to compare the quotations of such stocks in Nov. 1890 (the date of the Baring-Lidardale arrangement) with those given in the papers received yesterday from England, viz:—

It would appear, therefore, that River Plate securities at to-day's quotations represent only 42 percent of what they were worth at the date of the Baring-Lidardale arrangement 15 months ago. In other words there is a loss of 58 percent. Now, we know as a matter of fact that the Bank of England and its

partners in the Baring guarantee took over the Uruguay United and a reduction of only 10 percent on the November quotations, and it is more than probable that the rest of Baring's stocks were taken on a similar scale.

If this be so the average at which the stocks were taken would be about 70, whereas their present value is only 35, or at most 35, that is half the amount for which they may be supposed to figure as assets of the Baring estate. We cannot, therefore, come to any other conclusion than that a loss of £3,000,000 (at least) must fall on somebody, and as it is most desirable that the banks and not the public should suffer, we emphatically re-assert our caution to John Bull to be on his guard against the philanthropic efforts of the stock-jobbers and their friends.
