The When the first failure was proclaimed by the chairmas of the Stock Exchange there was a momentary lull, then a wilder rush than ever to sell. This was repeated after each failure. Selling continued till noon with slight reactions. Later, the pressure ceased somewhat, but sales were large till the close. There was a slightly firmer tone during the final hour, but this was due to short covering. Net declines reached ten to fifteen points in many cases. The average of decline in international stocks was fully 10 per cent.

THE FALL IN "AMERICANS" IN LONDON. 
