Saturday, May 1st 1897. Gold Premium

Gold maintains a downward tendency still, and naturally so. In the face of a very roseate Message promised and extreme activity in the produce markets, the premium cannot react, and thus until these features have been duly discounted, the bears should be well able to hold their own.

Although with the monthly settlement just over it was expected there would be little interest in gold to-day, a good deal was done, a trifle over the million being the total, of which nearly half was for cash alone.

An extension of the frozen meat trade between the River Plate and this country has just been inaugurated at Newcastle-on-Tyne, where the first cargo has just arrived from Buenos Aires per the steamship Pampa.

Messrs. Puleston and Co., of La Plata, advise 24 arrivals and 21 departures in that port during April, all being steamers, with exception of 2 sailers arrived and 1 cleared.

Mr. A. Wilkes, concessionaire of the Tucuman Cotton Mill, granted by law of that province last year, left this evening for Montevideo to catch the s.s. Tonario, of the New Zealand Company, en route for London. We understand that Mr. Wilkes goes home on important business connected not only with the cotton industry of the province of Tucuman, but other matters in this market. We hope to hear from him soon from London.

Minister Villanueva has not only licked the army and navy into shape, but he also economized during his term of office, as the following figures of the Budget show: Economy in War Department \$1,550,570; Naval Department 2,576,888; To this must be added \$1,185,577 paper and 11,617 gold value of the goods stocked in the Commissariat; this makes a total of \$5,298,886.

The Mendocinos, and particularly the English colony in the vineyard of the Republic will be interested in knowing that Mr. Charles Jensen has bought out Mr. Belmont, the English tobaccoist there, and goes on with the business, having a large stock of all the best brands of tobacco and cigars in the market. The following table of stock quotations, which we take from the Journal of Finance, shows how our stocks compare with those of other South and Central American countries. Our colleague remarks that the revival of South and Central American Government stocks which marked the year 1896 has not been continued during the first quarter of the new year. With the notable exception of Mexico, Guatemala, and Costa Rica, all the securities of the various Governments show decline, and particularly those of Argentina and Uruguay. In the case of Venezuela and Ecuador the quotations at present ruling are the lowest of the year, but in all other instances the existing prices are slightly above bottom level.

The following gentlemen were elected yesterday on the board of directors of the Once Market Commercial Rooms—Nicaragua de Abellera, José Etcheberry, Esteban Ghirardo, Fañor Velarde, Francisco Ortiz, Manuel Baigaliqua, E. R. Goynecche, Julio Calvo. The report and balance sheet for the year ending March 1897 was read and approved.

On Monday March 15th, the sum of \$2,667,079.51 was paid at the Custom House of New York for duties on imports. This is the largest amount ever collected at New York in one day. At 3 p.m., the hour for closing the cashier's office, there were 80 brokers in line waiting to pay duties, and the cashier declined to accept payments from all of them and also issued passes to 20 others who came at 4 p.m. The last money was received at 4.10 p.m. One hundred payments in an hour and ten minutes—!—and fifteen minutes later the balance between cash and accounts was struck and the figures announced: \$1,458,693 was collected on Saturday making over 4 millions in two days.

Advices from 9 de Julio and other departments report that a good number of cows and steers in prime condition have been sold at \$21 and 85 per head respectively. Cattle in Ayacucho are also in excellent condition and steers fetch \$30 to 35 per head. We shall soon have butter from Tandil, as the factory there is on the eve of being opened.

The market is evidently growing very enthusiastic over the coming Message—we had almost said Messiah—which is looked forward to as a harbinger of all that a beaerish imagination can paint of bright and glorious. That it will be cheerful, harmonious, hope-inspiring document "canta va sans dire." All Messages, at least here, are so. They would not be Messages otherwise. But it is not the Message redolent of good intentions that will cause apprehension, but the well-springs of beneficence underlying a soft-hearted Congress, which invariably throws economy and parsimony to the winds when the cry of distress breaks on its tympanum. What boots it that the Executive pinches and starves to make ends meet, if Congress scatters broadcast. And when people reflect that with the Cedula issue having proved a fiasco, a paper issue will most assuredly be mooted to save agriculture, immediately there is the misgiving that Congress will not turn a deaf ear. However, this is as yet veiled in the mists of the future, and for the moment the slumbers grow bristly on. The market is suggesting. At the second hour the rate opened at 295 and dropped heavily to 294 at which it closed, a point pass being paid for end of month. For other dates there was no interest, and the total was a good deal short of the 1/2 million. Stocks were practically neglected. After the hour business in gold kept on the tall too, the price at 3 o'clock being 293.

Imports and exports to-day. Returns of the year up to date. Difference in favour of 1897. The Minister of Finance has fixed the price of gold for payment of Customs duties at 294 for Monday, May 3rd.

The Commercial Crisis is still gathering. Three more failures to-day, unimportant as regards capital involved but a significant addition to the list, and what is more significant still, is a report that seven houses in Santa Fe have closed their doors. This has not been unexpected, as it was impossible the Granary could have escaped when it has been the main-spring of the distress, but still seven houses smashing up all in a breath is staggering. We have the news from one of the leading firms in this market, so there can be little doubt of its veracity. Dr. Udaondo, whatever may be his political leanings and failings, deserves unstinted praise for admirable administration. The province of Buenos Aires is recuperating at a rate that astonishes everyone, and if the foreign creditors really grasp this, and can place reliance on its continuance, there will be some difficulty about the share they offered for repayment of services. The balance sheet of the Provincial Treasury for April shows \$212,184 receipts of which \$202,500 correspond to stamp duties, \$108,227 land tax and \$74,000 licenses. The port dues are set down at \$26,724, whilst the receipts from the port railway were \$91,000. With everything paid and the accounts "al dia," there still remains a balance of \$196,314 in the treasury. During the month \$51,959 in Treasury bills were amortized. The Directors of the Pobladores Railways Company have made their report for 1896. During the year they have transferred to the Rosario Railway 25,629 square metres of land, and in a few months the remaining 21,135 metres will have been also transferred, when the Company can be liquidated. The capital has been reduced \$859,377, by the sale of lands in exchange for shares to the amount of \$137,222. The Company still possesses the following lands: at Oghlan 2830 square metres, Mitre 60,331, Florida, 643,889 San Isidro 5563, San Fernando 6390, Tigre and Las Conchas 24,273. Total 1,743,145 square metres. The Balance sheet shows that, to represent the said land, the cost price of the unsold land was \$1,254,600, and that the other assets, including furniture, judicial deposits for expatriation and cash in hand at the Bank amount to \$24,821, making a total of \$1,279,421, thus leaving a profit balance of \$420,041.

At the Cabinet Council yesterday a thorough study of all the economies possible to be effected in the Expenditure was made. The amount of gold withdrawn from liquidation to-day was \$520,000. There was no action. The R.M.S. Minho leaves Rio tomorrow for Santos and the Plata with passengers and cargo, but the Danube which will leave on Tuesday from Rio will bring later dates.

It seems a pity that the report of gold having been shipped by the packet was a quagmire, as we are informed by the agent that she took no specie whatsoever. Rumour, ye sargamena! The Government to-day decided to accede to the petition of the Centro Azucarero to grant the bounty-voted for next year—in the exportation of sugar. The bounty, however, will only hold good on sugar-exported up to the 15th of this month. The amount exported will be discounted from next year's for the purposes of the bounty. Mr. Martin Meyer, the leading hide-broker, reports as follows for the fortnight— Sales from 15th to 30th April 1897— 20,000 dry ox-hides for N. America.— Classified and "desecho" hides from this province at \$3.20 to \$3 gold. Entre Rios and Corrientes at \$3.10 and 2.90 gold.
