The bears succeeded in hoisting 298 % before the return swing set in which put the price high aud dry at 300.50. The marked feature if anything, however, was not the rally in rates but the first symptoms of a revival in business on time, which if continued will assure more confidence and greater stability. Since the Castells 'krach' transactions for other dates than the current month have been remarkable for meagreness, due partly to the distrust which that snag-up gave rise to, and the growing depression in trade generally. This seems now to be giving way, that is the distrust, as the depression in trade will not work out in a day, nor in a week nor in a month. Much will depend on how the next harvest shews, but it is very clear that meantime we have to face the winter with pinched means and scant resources. That gold should keep up, therefore, is the natural consequence, and will not inspire apprehensions. We are not with those who think that the price has hardened because there are signs of convulsion in the interior, presaging, we think, a stormy presidential campaign. Those in touch with the political movement and feeling attach no importance whatever to the San Luis and Santa Fé effervescences, mere local squabbles, and it is looked upon as a foregone conclusion that General Roca will be hailed president without the slightest opposition. The future has no terrors. It is the present that looks clouded and puts a backbone into the premium.

The business in gold at the first hour ran to a trifle over the million, of which cash, end of month and June accounted for nearly all. The price opened weak, dropping from 299 to 298 %, but towards the close there was such a sustained demand that sellers were able to get 2 points higher, and a half point steady pass for end of month with a further 1 1/4 point for June.
