The prosecution is on account of offence against the honor and private tran-quillity of Carvalho, and of grave threats against his life and individual liberty. These offences, he claims, are penalised in the first case by eighteen months' imprisonment, or a fine of two thousand dollars; and in the second case by three to six months' imprisonment! In his deposition Carvalho states that he had the misfortune to kill Mr. Frank Lewis of the Central Uruguay Railway, but that he only did it in defence of his honour, which was vilely outraged, and of his lite which was seriously threatened. For this he was duly tried but was acquitted, and therefore he is an innocent and irreproachable man. But, notwithstanding this acquittal, Mr. Denstone, the editor of the Montevideo Times, has published a series of articles in that paper, and afterwards in translation in the Dia, in which the affair is repeatedly referred to as a murder, in which Carvalho himself is spoken of as an assassin; in which it is said that he would certainly have been hanged, if the affair had been committed in England; in which it is suggested that he ought to be lynched and so forth generally exposing him to common hatred and contempt. These articles constitute the offence complained of, and for which the prosecutor demands against us the full penalty of the law. We have reterred

ON 'CHANGE.

Saturday, May 15th 1897. Gold Premium

With gold remaining over very weak from yesterday, and the fortnightly set-tlement coinciding with the usual Satur-day's requirements, both bears and bulls expected to see things moving very brisky, naturally each side to its own mind. The result satisfied neither, as the rally was of the very flimsiest kind, certainly not of a stamp to base hopes upon of any-thing very definite later on. The fall has been arrested, but the bulls have made up none of the lost ground; the six points fall is still there. Thus it must be confessed that the bears have the best of the argument so far, and if there were any outlook at all reassuring as regards exchange for the next three months, the conditions might be considered satisfactory. But with produce well nigh exhausted, exchange can only keep firm conditional on gold shipments, a phase not calculated to keep quotations on the decline. It seems to be a pretty general impression that gold shipments are at an analysis of the conditions of end-a consummation devoutly to be wished. If there were no requirements perhaps it would be so, but it is very certain that the banks cannot enter the market without sweeping everything up and precipitating rates, a result they will strive to avert at all hazards, which must mean necessarily falling back on the extreme but always efficacious recourse of shipments. The cry of "wolf" is on every lip. People keep up an endless iteration of the absolute paralysis of trade, to convince themselves perhaps that nothing is eing sold and no remittances to be made. In part, even to a great extent, it is true, but for all that trade is never so dull here but there is lots of life, stir and business. A leading banker tells us the depression complained of on all sides is greatly exaggerated, so that the remittances have to and are, going forward. This means demand for bills, and the supply will necessarily be very meagre for some months, which would seem to point to a higher premium. Yet we have to report the gold market weak, unnerved and

lmost unhinged; quite abnormal. The fluctuation in gold to-day was quite insignificant. Prices at the first hour may be said to have moved within the narrow margin of a point, which is remarkable, inasmuch as nearly 1 1/4 million dollars changed hands altogether. The rumours of emission and news of the locust invasion in Entre Rios seemed to ave no effect, at least they did not influence prices, which opened at 298 and closed at 298.20, a 30 cents pass being paid for end of month and about 1% point for June. After the hour there was very little done and rates remained unchanged Stocks were quite neglected.

the purchase of Mr. George Mackern's stationery business by Mr. W. Kraft of directory fame, the well-known lithographer. We understand that another leading stationery business, in the Calle Florida, has also changed hands, though the de-

tails are still kept in reserve. The reported arrangement of the Government with the railway companies for construction of the new Central Station has caused a very favorable impression in the market, since so long as the Government held on to its expressed intention of doing the job itself, there was little prospect of a start ever being made. Then again the Government's resources are not so plentiful as to admit of much testing as to elasticity, so that for various reasons of moment such an arrangement as would take the business off its hands on reasonable terms is to be hailed with satisfaction. Mr. White on behalf of the several companies proposes to do the business for about 3 millions of gold dollars, which would be raised on bonds bearing 4% interest and 1% amortization. thus making an annual service of \$150,000 gold. The Government estimated the cost at 4 millions gold, but we understand is favorably disposed towards the proposal, always reserving right of expropropriation, or to increase the rate of amortization. The main point is that the station is almost a vital necessity, and the Executive should make as little delay as

possible in taking final steps.

We are glad to hail the reappearance of the New York Life again in our midst. It was a source of regret that the bias against Foreign Life Assurance in Congress should have driven out the New York, Standard and Equitable, so that it is with pleasure we notice the return of the first. Perhaps this will induce

the Standard and Equitable to follow suit. In another column we publish the notice of the company.

Although it is a very general cry with Insurance agents that times are hard and money hard to make, the business is not gone to the dogs yet, as Mr. Almiraty Lasalle, who has just arrived back from a run through Cordoba and Tucuman, says he booked over \$800,000 in policies and got the premium money down on the nail too. All this business we understand is for the Peruvian Company, a native concern once in the throes of dissolution but now under Mr. Casares' able management enjoying a very high repute.

A very important business has just been closed off. Mr. J. B. Medici has signed a contract with Engineer Carlos M. Nolasco to deliver all the granite necessary for the building of Congress Hall, and which will run to about 1% million of dollars. The stone comes from the Medici quarries n Minuano.

There are already very ominous rumours anent new emissions in the ambient, which will undoubtedly take a more menacing shape as the cry tor help from the agricultural districts gathers volume.
