nil; speculation is inert; there absolutely seems to be no way out of the doldrums. Opinion is condensing and ideas converging on the inevitability of a bullish swing, as things are certainly not improving nor likely to do so, whilst that exchange has rallied conveys no hope of any stability in this line for later on. It was only natural that the exchange rates should react on the relief afforded by the specie shipments. If the big requirements are covered by export of metal, it is quite clear that the market has to recover some of its buoyancy, but that we are neither going to have lower rates nor further shipments will only be accepted when time will have shown it to be no optimist hope but actual fact. It seems to be admitted that the wool clip instead of being over will be a trifle under that of last year, since we see a smaller stock by about 2 millions in the market and the camp sending in little; again the cereals are pretty well exhausted and also coming in slowly, whilst the saladeros, with Rio exchange and prices at bedrock limits, have to go "dead slow." every head they slaughter meaning dead loss. This, apart from fears of possible emission and apprehension of locust ravages, are enough to make the ambient smell and smack fearfully bullish; yet the market is stuck hard bogged, and apparently helpless. We may state that the Metternichs of the may state that the Metternichs of the ring are all bulls in theory but not in practice. They bought and waited, sold with a loss and bought again, till tired of waiting they have liquidated for good and are now mere speculators for the moment. Except for the guttersnipes who follow every move of the board and pick up the crumbs, the market is a hore up the crumbs, the market is a hopeless puzzle. The bullish reaction has to

come, in the opinion of everybody, but nobody can fix a date, even approximately.

Any solid bearish pressure would drive the market to-day like chaff before a gale, for the very simple reason that there is not even the semblance of a back bone left; but on the other hand, this abnormal condition makes isolated action give little or no result, carries no impression with it. The price opened at 297,80, and closed exactly a point higher, with about a point and a half pass for June. After the hour the price remained very firm at 299,20.
