First Ring..... 194.70 SECOND RING..... 194.30 An appreciation of the shinplaster, or n other words, decline in the premium, of the dimensious and kind the market is witnessing at present, slow, steady and almost free from fluctuation, is the very acme of desirability, inasmuch as it holds out some promise of continuance and does not, therefore, shelter lurking apprehensions of violent reactions. We may presume from this, even if there were no other considerations, resisting that ways other considerations pointing that way, which at the same time are not lacking, that the fall is perfectly spontaneous, or at least not the consequence of any speculative manœuvring or artificial pressure. A drop of any serious consideration would not be exempt from danger, nor "a fortiori" would an advance. For one thing, apart from the check to business that violent fluctuations would entail, a pronounced movement one way or the other, with the market in a still precarious position, would cause panic or certainly great uneasiness, as things are moving now sedately, slowly and calmly, the market is righting itself by degrees. We find exchange improved also, little disposition to take, and bills offering, which is satisfactory, so that, taking things all round, the clouds certainly appear to be lifting, The commercial crisis has not turned out anything like so severe as was expected, and con ditions in general, comparing April with May, shew distinct improvement. Even the political horizon is clear, and, though the masses are gathering and organizing for the Presidential campaign, it is all on one side, the opposition being disarmed by the candidature of General Roca. Thus we are starting the winter under much more favorable conditions than was anticipated, when the crisis in commerce and shortage of cereals and wool threw a gloom over everything. If it only lasts this ray of sunshine. That's the rub.

Business in gold at the first hour was much brisker than on any day during the week now closed, and worked on a minimum almost of oscillation, the cash price having opened at 294 to close at 294.70. whilst the pass for the end of the month has given out, and that for July narrowed down to less than a point. In all over a million dollars changed hands. After the hour the supply was firm and the quotation remained steady at 294.20. Stocks ruled very quiet. Some National G's were done at 84 and Catalinas at 7.80, though the speculation in the latter stock seems to have fizzled, which seems strange, with the news of the re-construction confirmed, which should give better tone to the stock. We find the following, touching results of feeding tests, in an exchange, which chronicles another victory for the Polled Angus a breed that seems to be steadily to the fore, though not such a prime favorite with Argentine breeders as its merits would warrant:—"The Missouri Agricultural College experiment station has been testing the feeding and growing qualities of different breeds of cattle, and the result all round has been a victory for the Angus cattle, with shorthorns second. Summarised the test may be given as follows:—The breeds range in point of economy of beef production—Angus, Grade, Scrub, Shorthorn, Hereford; in points of rapidity of growth-Angus, Grade, Hereford, Shorthorn, Scrub. In points of early maturity, in power of attaining heavy weight, and in certainty of commanding a market at profitable prices, the breeds range—Angus, Shorthorn, Grade, Hereford, Scrub, Stall feeding and two-and-ahalf to three years of age are best adapted for growing cattle for market. Under these conditions breeds rank—Shorthorn, Angus, Grade, Hereford, Scrub. As to net product Hereford leads, closely followed by Angus, Grade, and Shorthorn, Scrub at the end after a measurable in terval. In quantity of fat produced, breed exerts an influence, and looking at the question from a commercial standpoint, Shorthorn and their grades are more superior and more profitable than other breeds of cattle. In points of palatability, or rather juiciness of flesh, Angus and Shorthorn are ahead of Scrubs. Short-


