life of the great naturalist Audobon has been brought to light by the death of the ex-Confederate General Rozier, whose father went to Missouri when the valley of the Mississippi was a wilderness, and left Pittsburg on a flatboat, and floated down the Ohio. Audobon was his companion, and for many years they conducted a general frontier trading and merchandise business at Ste. Genevieve. The senior Rozier was energetic and frugal, and wrote complain- portionately moderate. ing letters of his partner's conduct, and some of these letters found their way into his son's hands. In one of the letters he writes."Audobon spends his time wandering through the woods and believe the 'fellow is losing his mind. Sometimes I don't see him for a week at a stretch. Then he turns up with a lot of dead birds that are not fit to eat and his pockets full of leaves and flowers that nobody wants". It has been a puzzle to some that exchange should all at once shew such pertinacious buoyancy without any ostensible reason, but the latter is now beginning to peer out when reports are affoat of leading firms all being desirous to draw. The question is, what is it they are anxious to discount. and the answer is patent—General Roca's advent to power again. Ho!
