In answer to your question about Cotton-growing in this country, I have been for some time paying attention to it, and more than 18 months ago sent a small sample, in seed, grown near here, to Liverpool, but the report upon it was far from satisfactory.

It is course in quality, dirty. and hort staple, worth per 1b. 6 1/2d in seed as per sample 2d and 9 1:2d. Now, according to my own judgment, and comparing it with a sample of American cotton, I had, it was quite the reverse, being fine, as fine as Pernumbuco, long staple, but it was ra-ther discolored, having had it on hand some time before sending it. I inclose you a little of the same for your inangetion. Last spring I planted a few seeds

rather late; a few came up, flowered,

but did not ripen, from the frost havog caught them : but my chaera is situnted on very high land, close to town, very much exposed to the south wind, and as yet no shelter, from being only one year under cultivetion. I have one small plant from American seed, but it has suffered more from the frost than the native hore it would be always necessary to cut down the plant in winter, covering the stem with the cut branches to protect it from the frost, and ext spring it grows with double strongth; but, as a speculation, I am alraid it will not answer, requiring too much expense in the first ploughing and the pla ting requiring too much ground, as I see from your paper that, under the best circumstauces, one acre would only produce 250lbs of cotton wool. Calculating two acres and a quarter to the square of this country, it would require a large tract of land to produce anything of conse quence. Posides, labour here is too scarce and dear, to undertake anything of the kind, with a prespect of success. Such, however, is not the case in Corrientes ; there labour is much cheaper and more abundant; the blant also thrives much bette Hawever, I intend to continue my experiments, and if you would have the kindness to forward me a little seed, I will make a better trial of it : say, prepare and well manure the ground. trying different classes of soil, &c. Being rather pressed for time, I defer the subject for another opportunity. Yours. Ac-

TRAVELS IN LA PLATA. CHAPT XXIV Indian Bridges.

The means of crossing the rivers in Pecu are equal'y simple and dancerous; as those in the Argentine provinces and excite a feeling of futuporable nervousness : they also consist , of a bales and a bridge made of matting, which may be appropriately called a "Bridge of Sighs" from those that involuntarily arise on crossing them The balon is constructed in the follow ing manner .- take three long poles, thrust one of them perpendicularly three feet into the ground on each bank of the river; then place the third in an horizontal position, securing its extremities to the upright poles, by pieces of thick cord, previously insertng the handle of a wide and deep backet, to which a long piece of cord is attached - Your balsa is then made and ready for use.-The traveller gets into this barket, and is gradually drawn across the river along the pole. by two or three ladians on the opposite bank who pull the cord attached to it. Some of these baleus are three
