## IMPORTANT COAL DISCOVERY.

The Chilian Government having re ceived information of the existence of ome large coal-beds in the southern part of the Republic has engaged Don Luis Larocque to inspect the locality and report on the quality of the coal and the probable extent of it. From the reports circulated in Valparaiso and Santiago, it is generally believed that the coal region is very extensive and the Chilian Government, which is the most go-ahead administration in South America, is determined to make the most of it.

We may here observe that but a few leagues distant from Azul, in the province of Buenos Avres, there exist valuable coal mines, which if our Government would only take in hand, might prove of immense value. ## SINKING OF THE PRIVATEER FLORIDA.

The full particulars of the sinking of this noted privateer steamer, in Hamp ton Roads, off Newport News, are thus given by a Fortress Monroe correspon dent of the New York "World." "On the 18th of November the Flo

rida was ordered by the Navy Depart ment to be taken up the James River and anchored under the guns of the ram Atlanta, off Newport News. On England has been lowered to 6 per the 19th the Florida went to Norfolk for coal, and just before starting was run into by the transport steamer Alliance. and very seriously damaged. The transport struck her on the bow, knock ing off her head chains and booms and otherwise injuring her. She was in very bad condition when captured and all the time since her arrival there she has leaked so badly as to keep the steam pump engaged continually. The collision with the Alliance greatly in creased 'the volume of' water which was secured from the Atlanta, and the two were kept uninterruptedly at work. The position of the vessel was about a quarter of a mile from the shore, and three-quarters of a mile below Atlanta Here she had remained since the 20th.
