LATEST FROM ENGLAND.

Cardinal Wiseman is dying: the bulletins of the 7th of February announced that he had rallied a little, but next day he was again sinking.

Our colleagues got the start of us yesterday, having received the news from Europe through the Brazilian gunboat which arrived on Wednesday evening.

The British parliament was opened on Feb. 7th, the speech from the throne being read by a Royal commission. Her Majesty does not think the arrangement of the Sleswig-Holstein question gives the least motive for alarm to the general peace of Europe.

The French Chambers were to open on Feb. 15th, and the Government had suffered another defeat in the elections at Charente.

In Italy, after the debate of January 23rd, several Deputies absented themselves, and only on the 30th, owing to great efforts, was a sufficient number obtained to form a quorum for discussing the new method of administration, which was voted on Feb. 2nd.

The state of Greece is most alarming, and the whole country is a prey to anarchy. Madrid papers are to Feb. 10th, Queen Isabella in view of the opposition made to the forced loan sent for General O'Donnell, duke of Tetuan, to consult him about the formation of a new ministry.

merchants and others complained of the heavy brokerage charged upon all transactions in Bolivianos and National Bonds: it was proposed to reduce this brokerage to a uniform rate of 1/2. BARING COVERAGE AT THE RETIRO.

In such a terrible disaster there can be but one consolation alike for the relatives of those who are lost as for those who are saved and for their friends,—this is, to know that the officers and crew did their best; and this consolation we have no doubt will be afforded when we receive more complete details: From the report before us there is every reason to anticipate this melancholy satisfaction. In the face of a conflagration of such frightful rapidity it cannot but have required the utmost coolness and discipline to save so considerable a proportion of the crew; and, when we read of the sick having been passed into the boats in the first instance, we are reminded of the spirit which was displayed in the case of the Birkenhead, and cannot but believe that both officers and men must have displayed an equal courage and self-sacrifice.

As to the cause which produced the disaster, and the reasons which rendered it so uncontrollable, the present report fails to give us any sufficient information. The fire broke out in the after-hold, and from the uncontrollable rapidity with which the flames spread the Admiral inclines to think that it must have broken out close to the spirit-room, "and that the spirit casks must almost immediately have burst and ignited."
