REVOLUTION IN PERU.

INDIAN OUTBREAK IN CHILE.

We have received files from Lima to he 10th and Chile 21st alf. with most disastrous news.

The riots at Callao on Feb. 5th were attended with much loss of life, a dozen Spaniards being killed or mortally wounded, and a much larger number of citizens injured by the troops firing on them. When the news of the outbreak reached Lima next day the excitement became intense, and it was learned that the mob of Callao had torn up the railway as far as Bella Vista. Numbers of people wanted to start at once for Callao, but no train was allowed toleave, and the station-offices were closedby a troop of cavalry and gendarmes. Groups of boys paraded the streets at sunset uttering seditious cries, and stopped before the theatre, where the crowd increased and then proceeded to the principal plaza. Strong speeches were made to the excited multitude, and at 9.30 a body of gendarmes was seen entering by the calle Mercaderes and assailed with stones by the populace, which compelled them to retire. But at eleven o'clock the cavalry and horse police came to disperse the mob, and a regular melée ensued, the former firing several volleys in reply to showers of stones: the rioters assembled at the entrance of the Hotel Morin, and after a sanguinary conflict took refuge inside the hotel, leaving several killed and wounded and over 100 prisoners in the hands of the troops. Next morning crowds again began to assemble, but were dispersed by the garrison, patrots of horse and foot keeping the streets clear and holding all the important thoroughfares. All the Sp2nish officers in Lima left by train same day, and the agitation of the populase caused the Government great apprehension. The palace was full of troops and a battery of artillery protected the entrance, no one being allowed admission on any pretence. All shops and public offices were closed, and on the 7th a decree from the President was published declaring both Lima and Callao in state of siege.
