THE PARAGUAYANE IN MISIONES.

The Era arrived yesterday evening with dates from Concordia and Gualeguaychú to the 23rd inst.

A letter from Paso de los Libres, 19th inst. has the following news. The National Guard is rapidly mustering under its officers and chiefs, and the Correntine force when ready to march will be considerable. General Benjamin Virasoro, at the head of 1,000 Paraguavan soldiers, established himself on the 15th at Saladas, but it does not appear the natives join him. Governor agraña must have reached Mercedes to-day, as he had a very narrow-escape: General Caceres and his men have mar ched to the same place. The horses and postilions of the post-roads escaevening, 3 p m., from Santo Tomé with news that the Paraguayans have destroyed all the Argentine 'Yerbales, and are pushing forward at forced
