A few days ago we adverted to the damaging rumors going the round of Freuch and English journals in Europe, and probably originated by the crafty and influential Paraguayan agent's abroad, relative to a pretended arrangement between Brazil and the River Plate for the conquest of Paraguay and closing all the rivers against politics, nothing being known from the foreign trade. Believing, as we still do, that the interests of Buenos Ayres are allied with the free-navigation of the rivers, and that President Mitre, no matter what his opinion formerly, is now a decided advocate of this policy, we ventured to contradict the plausible calumny which has gained some credence in Europe; and promised that the Triple Alliance about to be submitted to Congress would give a triumphant confirmation to our assurances.

We are, therefore, sadly disappointed to find that the Congress of the Nation has discussed and approved with closed doors this all-important treaty, of which the public is so justly anxious to be informed, and which wili be regarded with increased suspicion in Europe, as there is no apparent mo tive for keeping its terms secret. The discussion, we are informed, lasted over three hours, shewing the importthe diversity of opinion respecting them. Several of the Senators thought the secret session unadvisable, and we regret their wishes for publicity did ving been promised from England. not prevail. Those Consular arms were torn down by a Brazilian subject, who tied them to the tail of his horse and dragged them through the streets, for which offence he was arrested and confined in jail till the Brazilian Vice-Consul at Tacuarembó interfered in his behalf and requested he might be set at liberty.

There are, as I understand, various other complaints likely to be touched on by Senhor Saraiva to which equally satisfactory replies can be given, yet the grievances of which Brazilians in this country have to complain are so numerous that no hopes can be entertained that the Government of the Republic will be in a position to meet them all triumphantly, and should many, of these complaints become the subject of debate I cannot but fear the discussion will prove likely to take a complicated turn.
