LATEST FROM THE U. STATES ASSASSINATION OF LINCOLN AND SRWARD.

SUPPRISORS OF GENERAL LER

The 'Tribuna' supplement of yester has arrived in Buenos Ayres.

The English steamer Flamingo, from Barbadoes brought dates to Rio Ja-April. The news is very afflicting: we learn that President Lincoln and Secretary Seward were barbarously murdered almost at the same moment at half-past ten o'clock on the night of the 14th, the former at the Forde theatre, and the latter in his bedroom. The pages of history record few crimes of so appalling and daring a character-The 'New York World' gives the following particulars :-

A horrible crime, an unexampled murder was committed last night in the Forde theatre a little before 11 o'clock. President Lincoln, his wife, and several friends were sitting in their private box on the second tier, right of the stage, witnessing the play "Our American Cousin," when a slight pause occurred in the 3rd act, at the moment that one of the characters should come out; suddenly a pistol shot was heard, which, however, would have caused no surprise, but that at the same time a man was seen to jump from the President's box into the pit, IMPORTANT NEWS FROM BRAZII a height of 10 feet, brandishing an enormous knife with which he crossed the stage, and rushed out on the opposite side reaching a small square where a horse is supposed to have been in readiness for him, which favoured his escape, for he disappeared with the rapidity of lightning down Tenth Avenue.

The occurrence was so sudden that all the audience was thunder-struck, and only aroused by the cries of Mrs. Lincoln calling for help. The crowd then rushed to the President's box. and soon learned the awful reality.
