The fight must have been obstinate, for the allies lost 300 men, but even at this cost the victory was cheap, and the Argentine flag was again hoisted over the capitar of the Province.

It is impossible to exaggerate the praise due to Pannero and Barroso for their daring and successful enterprise or the importance of this masterly stroke which has restored the prestige of the national cause, and intercept the invading army. The consequences will soon be felt, in placing the enemy on the defensive, and cutting short his march through the Argentine provinces.
