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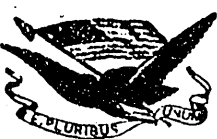

THE FOURTH OF JULY.

Since the Declaration of American Independence, never before have the citizens of the United States and the friends of human progress throughout the Globe had so much reason to rejoice as in saluting the glorious anniversary of to-day.

Language is weak to express the wonderful development of the United States in all the arts of peace; in commerce, industry, law, science, invention, machinery, exploration, and their concomitant aids, as railways, canals and other public works.

The rebellion of the South came to check for an interval this onward march of industry and civilization, and prove that the same daring enterprise, determined energy, and matchless valor were characteristic of the whole American people.

Thank God, and we say it sincerely, the termination of the war has resulted in the consolidation of the work of Washington. Like Moses leading the chosen people into the Promised Land, which he only saw from a distance when God called him to Himself, the late President Lincoln was permitted to see his great work drawing to a happy end without living to enter into its fruition.

The quiet transition of power, after so violent a bereavement, and amid the turmoil of war and faction, which accompanied the accession of the actual President, is a splendid proof of the perfectibility of Republican institutions, and one of which Americans may well be proud.

England is proud of the great people sprung from her own blood, speaking her own language, and possessing her own talents and energies; and Americans despite the passing troubles of an hour have always a chord of sympathy and affection for the mother-country in preference to any other.

We are happy to be able to day to offer our warmest congratulations to the American people, on the 89th anniversary of Independence, and hope that the new era of peace on which it is now entering may last till the end of time and be attended with unexampled progress and prosperity.

VERY LATEST FROM URUGUAYANA

ADVANCE OF THE PARAGUAYANS.

FLIGHT OF THE SETTLERS.

A German gentleman yesterday favored us with a private letter dated June 25th, which he just received from Uruguayana, giving the following important details.

THE AMERICAN SCIENTIFIC EXPEDITION.

We were favoured yesterday with a visit from Professor Carey, brother-in-law and companion of the renowned Dr. Agassiz chief of the American scientific expedition lately arrived in this continent.

Dr. Agassiz has met with a most friendly reception from the Emperor Dom Pedro, and at his invitation lately delivered a highly interesting course of lectures to the Court, in the French language. The Emperor has, moreover

tornished him with a steamer to explore the coasts and ascend the River Amazon and its tributaries, which will occupy the party until the month of November, when they will turn their steps southwards, to the River Plate. They have already discovered 15 new kinds of fishes unknown to the world of science, among the Brazilian waters, and we may mention that Dr. Agassiz is reckoned the best Ichthyologist of the present day, in which department also he states that Professor Carey is a most diligent and discriminating collector: the latter made several valuable discoveries in California.

We have presented Professor Carey with a curious and venomous snake supposed to belong to the Cobra Capello family sent to us recently by a friend from Corrientes, and preserved in spirits of wine: it will be handed over to the Boston Museum with the rest of the collection. Meantime Mr. Carey will shortly leave for Brazil to join his company, and we may expect Dr. Agassiz and the whole party towards the close of the year, when they will commence their explorations in Banda Oriental, and the Argentine Provinces, extending them to Bolivia, Paraguay and the upper Brazilian departments in case the state of affairs do not put an obstacle to their useful endeavours in the cause of Science.

THE HEALTH OF MONTEVIDEO

Yesterday the deaths summed up were 18, of which only one was marked as Brazilian, showing a large proportionate increase of deaths for the regular inhabitants of the city, a result naturally to be expected from the introduction of diseases into the midst of a population already suffering from other causes.

Last week, at the foot of Calle Misiones, I saw a carriage coming up from the water with four sick persons inside covered up with blankets. Standing on the pavement, near the old Cafe La Estia, it was easy to look into the carriage through the glass sash, as the pavement there is some three feet higher than the street.

Montevideo is a large seaport, and the country is eternally in war; and yet, there is now, and so far as I know, always has been good order preserved in the streets; and perfect protection and security for persons, ladies and children crowd the streets at night, and always without apprehension and without molestation.

creatures themselves they sow the seeds of disease broadcast through a population of fifty thousand souls. One is at a loss which to admire most, the vigilance and forethought of the Brazilian authorities in the care of their sick soldiers, or the vigilance and extreme care of the police authorities of Montevideo in the preservation of the health of its inhabitants.

In coming in from the new city, you have to pass through a line of wholesale and retail fruit merchants, who keep constantly exposed for sale a large amount of unripe and rotten fruit, admirably adapted to increase the business of the doctors. Besides these wholesale establishments, there are a large number of ambulating 'boticas,' in the shape of fruit baskets, filled with the same kind of rotten pills, warranted to produce first-rate stomach and bowel complaints.

In perambulations induced by business or friendship, I have noticed some places that may be called 'fountains of disease.' Amongst others, in the Calle Durazno, between the Calles Arapey and Dayman, is a great bank of offensive decaying animal and vegetable matter, being the accumulated offal from the houses in front of it. It must have been accumulating for months if not for years; the police carts never pass by there.

If the police be negligent or ignorant on the care of the public health, they appear to afford efficient protection to persons and property.

EDITOR'S TABLE.

Sunday in Buenos Ayres is always a dull day, we have no public parks or gardens; the suburbs are at this season cold, cheerless, and weedy: the Retiro, which was once a fashionable promenade is now deserted and, in fact the Mole is the only place on which citizens can stretch their legs.

The Tevere arrived from the Uruguay on Sunday morning bringing down some few passengers and very little news. She left in the evening for Montevideo. The Oriental army, some thirteen hundred strong, have crossed the Uruguay and are encamped along with the Argentines two leagues north of the town of Concordia; the Brazilian army is encamped two leagues South of the town, but, we

hear, have received orders to be ready at a moment's warning to march.

To day, being the 4th July, will be a strict holiday with all Americans. The Provincial Government has declared it a holiday, but, as the National Government has not done so, business will be carried on as usual in the city, with the exception of the Bolsa, which has been ordered to be closed by the Committee. A grand American banquet will be given to-night at the Provence; the members of the Nat. and Provincial Government will attend. It will, we have no doubt, be the grandest 4th of July dinner ever given in this city.

The native Insura Company, 'Porvenir de las Fam.' has opened a branch establishment in Montevideo. It affords us much pleasure to observe how successful its company is; it is doing an immense business, and has increased its number of policies within the last six months considerably.

Dr. Acosta, the late prime Provincial Minister, drew the large prize at the last Buenos Ayrean lottery; unfortunately he dropped the ticket in the street but, having a good memory recollected the number, and at once advertised; it was picked up by one of our city merchants, and, when the proof given, was at once handed back to the lucky winner.

The real author of the pamphlet recently published in Paris on the state of affairs in the River Plate is, we feel certain, Sr. Barreiro. This pamphlet is beyond all question an unjust slander on President Mitre's Government, and written for the sole purpose of injuring the Argentine Government abroad; in Barreiro's letters to Lord John Russell, published in the River Plate correspondence by order of Parliament, we find the same ideas expressed. Dr. Alberdi we don't think had anything whatever to do with the publication.

At a recent performance in the Solis Theatre the greatest confusion and excitement prevailed, owing to a rumour having spread that the doors were about to be closed and all the suspected Blancos then and there apprehended. The ladies retired at once, fearing a riot, but the whole thing was a sham. It seems that some of the new soldiers are so dressed that they were mistaken by the ticket-taker for policemen and got in free. Such a number of policemen caused suspicion and gave rise to the painful rumour which so nearly caused a disturbance.

The National Government has paid the 3rd call on the shares of the Argentine Central Railway Company. It invites all the shareholders to imitate the promptness of the Government.

Messrs Rallo and Co. have concluded a contract with the National Government for carrying the mails in Entre Rios from Concepcion to Nogoya and Tala. The Government gives the contractors a subsidy of twenty patacons per month.

Dr. Anacarsis Lamuz, the President of the Committee of Valuators for the Custom-house, publishes the reformer tariff or valuation, which is a document of the greatest importance to our mercantile community, but altogether too long for our columns.

To-night will be a grand night in Colon, 'Hail, Columbia,' by the whole operatic company, and then the favorite opera 'Martha.' We have no doubt the house will be crowded.

THE AMERICAN BANQUET.

Our American friends have Buenos Ayres to themselves to-day. The provincial Government has made it a holiday extra-muros, the Bolsa has also made it a 'jour de fete,' and to-night all the Government offices will be illuminated. The 'Standard' office will also be illuminated. Sig. Pestardo will give a grand operatic performance in the Colon theatre, playing the American, authors between the acts.

But the great event of the day is the banquet at the Provence Hotel, to which all the National and Provincial dignitaries are invited, and who have expressed their intention to attend. Covers will be laid for 70 persons, and the hall will be splendidly decorated with flags and portraits of Washington, Lincoln and Mitre. A band of music will attend.
