- NEWS OF THE PARAGUAYAN WAR. SYMPATHY FOR PAES MITRE. ARGENTINE SECURITIES FIRM.

I cannot conceal from you that the first intimation of the unwarranted outrage perpetrated by the Government of Paraguay on your frontier caused considerable uneasiness in monetary, commercial and trading circles here.

Birth of a Prince. We have the happiness to announce the birth of a second Prince, the grandson of her Majesty, the son of the Prince and Princess of Wales.

Death of Sir Joseph Paxton. We regret to state that Sir Joseph Paxton died yesterday morning at eight o'clock. The deceased gentleman was born at Milton Bryant in 1803.

France. The Emperor was not expected to return from Algiers before the 14th of June; peace was restored to that colony and a division of 4,500 men sent back to France.

Spain. Dates from Madrid to June 1st. The Queen and Court are at the palace of Aranjuez. Don Sebastian leaves for Portugal. The quarrel between Government and the press continues.

Portugal. The Bank of Portugal sent to London for gold, and imported 75,000 sovereigns, to make up for the frequent exportation of gold.

Belgium. King Leopold is convalescent and able to take an airing.

Switzerland. The Swiss Chambers are reforming the Federal Code.

Austria. The Reichsrath of Vienna is discussing the Budget. The Finance Minister declared that in 1866 the deficit will have been disappeared.

Prussia. The split continues between the Ministry and the Chamber. Count Bismark has challenged Deputy Voichow, and when the Chamber attempted to interpose the Minister of War declared Bismark was resolved to fight.

America. Reported Surrender of Kirby Smith. N. York, May 27 (evening). Commissioners from Kirby Smith, accompanied by General Herron and Commander Foster, arrived at Baton Rouge on the 23rd instant.

Mexico. Heavy skirmishing took place before this city on the 30th ult, resulting favourably to the Imperialists. General Negretti is believed to have withdrawn.

Prussia. The prohibition has been taken off exporting arms to Italy, and the Austrian and Italian soldiers on opposite sides of the Mincio are now quite friendly.

The Philadelphia papers reaffirm that Mr. Davis has been manacled. A boat with seven men en route for Havanna has been captured off the Florida Coast; they are supposed to be prominent fugitives from Richmond.

General Rosecranz, in a speech in Boston yesterday, denied a statement which had been extensively published, that he was organizing an army of 25,000 men for the Republican Mexican service.
