How is it that M. Cornac did not make this discovery about the Bank before? What motive arges him to take up so wonderful a thesis when the Bank-profits are so large, and the circulation of its specie certificates higher than at any former period? Why does not Llavallel, or Armstrong, or Thompson, or Peltzer [who are not Bank-Directors] and whose business exceeds millions, lend himself to the cry, if there be really any danger?

3rd. In Buenos Ayres there is scarce ly a tenth part of this population, and even of this fraction we may say that only one tenth part lead an active life, consisting as it does, almost exclusively of those who are occupied in at 40. commerce.

4th. On the other hand, in a question of this nature, it is necessary to consult also the manners and customs of the inhabitants, the resources of the country, &c. conditions which have a direct influence for good or bad on the undertaking, and which it is necessary to take into consideration before taking any steps in the matter; as we must admit that progress consists not only in innovation, but in the convenience and appropriateness of such innovation. Thus in Buenos Ayres, horses are abundant and cheap, and this means of locomotion is so suited to the customs and necessities of the 'Porteños,' that they will never abandon it, or diminish but little the use made of it.

It will not happen the same with the Country Railways, the necessity for which in this country is imperious and consequently the result they will give, will be undoubtedly good, as much for the public, who will profit by the advantages of rapid means of communication without any prejudice to their interests, as for the companies who undertake these enterprises and obtain from them lucrative benefits.

This question is unfolded at length n a pamphlet which I have just published on this matter with the title:-Economical Railways and the future of the Argentine Republic;" and in which, those interested will find allthe details economical, technical and financial which this subject comprises.

In the article to which I allude, the writer hopes that as the Municipality is now composed of a 'different class of men,' the question of 'City Railways' will, meet with every support from

Would it not be preferable, for the sake of obtaining the wished result, i. c "the facility of communications;" would it not be preferable, I say, that the Municipality should occupy itself in studying the means of improving our horse-roads, to mend at least some streets, which are now quite impassable to cross with a carriage, on account of the 'pantanos,' notwithstanding the present season of summer. I make reference particularly to the streets reference particularly to the streets approaching the 'Constitucion' market; these are in a very bad state and if they are not repaired now, in winter time the bullock-carts will not be able to come in or to go back.

The 'City Railways' cannot, in any way, supply in a city the 'good paved roads; 'and which improvement is now n Buenos Ayres, absolutely necessary and most urgent.
