Feb. 10th. Letters from the Argen tine encampment state that since the arrival of Mr. Washburne, American Minister, at Corrientes, messengers are constantly going and coming between that city and General Mitre's camp: it was even said to-day that the American gunboat was abreast of Paso la Patriaand that President Mitre was gone thither to meet Lopez and possibly conclude the war by a pacific arrangement. It is hard to say what weight can be attached to such rumors. Here we are cut off from all communication, and if I were to ride across to San Cosme I should have to swim in some places, and flounder through marshes.
