EUROPEAN POLITICS AND GOSSIP.

(From the Havas correspondence),

Paris, Feb. 7th, 1866. The first sessions of the Legislature have been occupied examining the elec

tion papers of the new Deputies. Today the project of a sinking-fund will be discussed, and the committee for the Budget appointed. The presence of M. Thiers at Count Walewski's soirée is commented on, as hanever attended the Duke de Morny's parties, and has not before entered an official saloon for 14 years. The 'blue' book, shewing the state of the Empire, and the 'yellow' book, with official despat ches, have been distributed among the high dignitaries and functionaries.

The question between Spain and Chile has a armed commercial interests and the Imperial Government, without interfering in Spanish grievances, offered its mediation at the cutset and is at present arranging with Great Britain to oblige the Republic of Chile to accept an amicable settlement, the terms of which have already been agreed to by Spain. The 'yellow' book also shows that France has vindicated the free navigation of the River Plate and its tributaries in the present war against Paraguay, according to the treaty of 1853.

It is rumored the Empress will be named President of the Exhibition Committee.

Fourth—Once the money deposited exceeds twenty five thousand dollars currency, or one thousand dollars silver, the depositor, if he wishes can open an account current, according to the rules established by the Yank.

Fifth—In case the depositor loses his pass book, it can be replaced by another on paying twelve dollars currency; and advertising the loss in the public newspapers.


