THE WAR IN THE NORTH. LATEST FROM HEAD-QUARTERS.

EXTRAVAGANT EXPENDITURE OF THE ALLIES Corrientes, March 16th.

The funeral of Brigadier Antonio Manuel de Melho, Comandante General of the Brazilian Artillery, took place on the evening of the 9th. He was interred in the cemetery de la Cruz. The corpse was taken to its last resting uniform, on foot, who walked in double file. Tamandaré and Barroso headed the procession. From the house where the distance was thirteen cuadras: there was 'not a funeral note' or 'farewell shot'; such had been the deceased General's desire. The colors at half mast were the only demonstration. At the cemetery we saw a number of respectable monuments, the ground, a cuadra, was inclosed with a wall and kept clean: the sexton could not tell the number of interments, but thought they might average sixteen per day. On the 11th the steamers Uruguay and Chacabuco arrived, they brought no mails. The Chacabuco brought from your port eleven of those that were sent hence to your city charged with having Paraguayan proclivities. They have returned in the same "contumelious state, unanointed and unanneal ed." At present they are incarcerated in the Policia. The Juez Federal has it in commands to proceed to investi gate their cases and apply the punish ment the law awards to treason.

So they put a light in the front of each, and sending them floating down the river succeeded in deceiving even the lynx-eyed Brazilians.

The mortification of those who had gained the victory may be better imagined than described, when its fruits were found out to be only a few planks and some half-dozen battered canoes, which had escaped, partially, the raking fire to which they were exposed.

On this discovery being made, it was discovered that the less said about the 'great naval encounter' the better. and orders were issued accordingly. As you perceive, however, the affair made too great a noise at the time to escape the vigilance of your correspondent. Although we cannot vouch for the certainty of all we convey to you, there is a great deal of truth in the above, to judge from its being in everybody's mouth, and the anxiety manifested in official quarters to husb the matter up.

## NEWS FROM CORRIENTES.

We have files of the 'Esperanza' and 'Nacionalista' to the 14th inst. Great discontent is felt at the obstinacy of the Brazilian fleet in refusing to emerge from a state of chrysalis. On the 14th all the vessels were gaily decked out in honor of the birthday of Princess Clothilde of Brazil; the 'Nacionalista' very pungently asks, When will they show off their bunting for a victory over the Paraguayans? The Brazilian Minister, Octaviano, arrived at Corrientes on the 13th. The 'Esperanza' 'has an article on the desertions from the allied army. Most of the Brazilian forces at the Bateria have been sent on board the fleet. The Belmonte is putting on chain armor, similar to that used by the Kearsage in her fight with the Alabama.

The 'Esperanza' of the 13th says-Everything indicates a speedy re-commencement of hostilities. The allied armies, so long encamped on the banks of the Parana, within cannon-shot of the enemy, have received all necessary supplies, reinforcements, and baggagetrains. The powerful Brazilian fleet has abundance of everything, including coal, and is anchored in our port, within two hours sail of Paraguay, only waiting the word to 'move up' from Admiral Tamandaré, who is at last on the spot, and if he should have any difficulty with General Mitre, there is the Brazilian Minister, in Dom Pedro's name, to set everything right. 
