two years it has returned 93 per cent. on its cost. Of this, 60 per cent. has been the gain of last year, after allowing 10 per cent. for deterioration of the steamer by use. The other vessel is the Solis, a little boat used to go over the rapids in low water, and so keep Salto connected with the rest of mankind. The value of the work of the Solis is beyond computation, as it carries mails, freight, and passengers, in time of low water from Paysandú to Salto, and return.

The Solis, made in England, was brought here in pieces and put up at the foundry of Mr. William Hardy. She draws three feet of water, a needless depth for a small river boat; she is finely furnished.

At the greater falls of the Uruguay, a little above the city, there were two projecting rocks, which greatly endangered navigation. A Frenchman, whose vessels are detained here by low water, has been employing his crew in blasting and removing them: the city gladly furnished the powder for the purpose.

A company in Salto has sent to Engauid for a small steamer to navigate the Uruguay, when the water permits. They expect to rival the thousands of ox carts that now carry goods to the Brazilian borders, and to Upper Corrientes. At present 800 ox carts are on that route all the time, carry to Salto 600 tons of produce monthly, and carrying back a similar quantity of merchandise monthly, such as salt, lumber, clothes, cotton goods, etc.

Salto has two well sustained banks, the Commercial and that of Messrs. Maná & Co., and a third, the Italian, is about to be commenced. It has one well built Roman Catholic church, and arrangements are made for soon having a Protestant church and school, and also a Protestant cemetery.

A new Gefe Politico has just arrived from Montevideo, and on being installed, the people were officially cited to assemble and hear the usual speech on such occasions. He has been so accustomed to the nightly cries of the 'serenos' of the capital, that the first remark proposed is to wake up these drowsy streets with the nightly and useless cries of the men with the lanterns. The chief necessity for these nightly watchmen, I am informed, is the disorder near the 'pulperias.' On the other side of the river they propose to do without the watchmen and abolish the 'pulperias.'

The Uruguay river is very low, so that the little steamer Solis does not dare to venture among the projecting rocks and along the shallow channels near Salto, except in daylight. The dangerous portions of the river are indicated by buoys made by tying inverted 'demijohns' to the rocks below, a primitive kind of buoy, which, it is hoped, the next generation of men will replace with better.

In all the upper river towns the demand for men for the war has been general and relentless. At a general meeting of the citizens of Salto, convened by the authorities on the 22nd inst: nearly all present were foreigners. There is no opposition to the Government here, nor, as far as I heard, distrust of it. Good news from the seat of war is looked for anxiously but confidently.

Owing to this being a half holiday there was very little business done on the Bolsa until about 1 o'clock. The brokers, dressed out in the very pink of fashion, came on 'change from the Cathedral steps. The Bolsa presented an unusually gay appearance, but this being the last day of the week and of the month, had to be attended to; the venciimientos, over 23 millions, showed the heavy speculation which had been going on during the month, everything up to 4 o'clock passed off well, all met their liabilities, and, in fact, we have seldom seen the finale of a month pass off with less of a squeeze.

The gold which was shipped for Corrientes was not taken from the Bolsa; most of it came from Montevideo, so that it but slightly affected the market. Paper money rules just as scarce as ever, the only large holder being the Provincial Bank. Specie opened at a rise of ten centimos on Saturday's price, and rose up to 26.20, under the impress that the Banca Bank would have to buy up gold, and also that several brokers had been speculating for a fall week ahead, and would be obliged to buy in at any price, but there was gold for all, and the market was felt so easy about half-past one o'clock, that prices dropped and closed weak at 26.15. Time contracts of war news seems to be singularly unfortunate. Tamandare's promise to occupy Asuncion on the 25th of March has proved a ruse, and even the news of the fall of Itapiru, which was anticipated by many, has not arrived at the specified time. Brokers and merchants wonder at the delay, and, as a matter of course, all sorts of rumors were current respecting Baron Tamandare. The news per Esmeralda is watched with the greatest anxiety, although few on the Bolsa think that either Humaitá has been attacked or the passage of the river attempted.

THE TOWN OF SALTO. Salto is the most enterprising of all the cities of the Banda Oriental, outside of Montevideo. It had a bank, originated by its own citizens long before there was one even at the capital of the nation. The first steamship company of these regions was organized at Salto, and it continued its benefactions on the Uruguay river until the fortunes of the late Argentine civil war caused the directors, by a sort of necessity, to sell out their steamers to General Urquiza for \$250,000 silver. The stockholders were greatly displeased at this, although it was the return for what cost them \$50,000 silver, not long before.

Another Salteña steamship company was formed, and five steamers were obtained, two of which have escaped the accidents of war, and of flood and flame. One of these was so skillfully managed as in six months to pay the company eighty per cent. on its cost. The Rio de la Plata is one of the series, and in

the, but the arrival of wheat, maize, etc., from the rivers very heavy. Maize has been during the last few weeks, 170 per bushel, and immense arrivals from Chile and Buenos Aires. We notice a new Barco started in Chacabuco by Messrs. Capdevilla & Justo. The business of that town is now so increasing that it is thought a baraca will pay well.

Respecting the Southern Railway, as the engineers have been down there, we hear much about the great necessity of extending the railway. One of the most influential property holders in the south has authorized us to say that the extension south of the Salto will give all the lands necessary gratis, and furthermore, subscribe for one thousand shares in the new company.

REPORT OF OUR PRODUCE EXPORTS FOR THE MONTH ENDING MARCH 18, 1866. Dry Ox and Cow Hides.—For the United States there was a pretty active movement during the early part of the month at former prices, but latterly the market has become rather weaker, although baraqueeros are as yet pretty firm in their rates. The sales have amounted to 67,000 lbs. for 33 to 37 1/2 lbs. for Entre Rios; 20 to 24 1/2 lbs. for Corrientes, 35 to 34 1/2 lbs. for 22 1/2 lbs. for this Province; last price 36 1/2 lbs., leaving a stock of 16,000 classified.

For Germany only 2,000 Matadero Ox have been sold at 4 1/2 lbs. for 29 lb. For France, Spain and Italy 18,500 have exchanged hands at 35 lbs. for; for Cordova 40 to 42 lbs. for heavy cow, 40 1/2 lbs. for ox; for 28 lb, 42 lbs. for narrow ox of 29 lb, 36 lbs. for wide horns for Spain, 36 lbs. for for calf-skins and kips, and 27 to 25 1/2 lbs. for cuts of 20 lb average; leaving 74,000 unclassified.

Wool.—In unwashed merino the movement during the early part of the month continued limited, in consequence of the scarcity of money, but latterly, owing to the receipt of more favorable advices from Europe, and an easier money market, a good deal more activity has been shown by purchasers for Antwerp and France, principally in milling qualities, of which the supply now chiefly consists; former prices are firmly maintained. For the United States there is also a good demand for prime lots, which are very scarce. The supplies received from the interior this month have amounted to about 335,000 lbs., which, with about 60,000 lbs. taken from deposit, in all 395,000 lbs. have been sold. The total receipts of this clip to date amount to about 5,100,000 lbs., the total sales to about 2,700,000 lbs., leaving about 2,400,000 still in deposit.

Washed Cordova was acquired for during the early part of the month, and some 700 bales and purchasers at 34, 35, 36 and 37 1/2 lbs., according to quality and condition, but latterly the demand has slackened, and within the last fortnight we only hear of the sale of 46 bales at 35 1/2 lbs. Washed Santiago; no sales or stock. We quote 36 1/2 lbs. nominal.

Washed Entre Rios, mixed; some 2,000 @ sold at \$1.6 1/2. Unwashed Entre Rios, ordinary; 654 bales have changed hands at 16 1/2 lbs. and 113 bales at 18 1/2 lbs. @.

Unwashed Corrientes; some 15,000 @ mixed, sold at 27 1/2 pl. and 1,000 @ ordinary, 24 1/2 pl. Unwashed San Juan, 80 scoops were sold in the early part of the month at 27 1/2 pl. @.

Horse Hair.—Of this province continues in good demand, but supplies are very limited; our last quotations of 400,000 @ still maintained; and 110 to 120 for southern are firmly maintained; other classes are less ordered at present. Nutria Skin.—Aro less sought after, but continues scarce, the only supplies now coming forward being those previously contracted for. Otchir Feathers.—The demand for this article has been very active and prices have advanced to 32 and 35 for Indian tuck, and 35 to 36 for loose, the supplies now coming to market, however, are very inferior, and a good article is consequently scarce.

Sheepskins.—The market is a little more animated but supplies are very limited and consist almost entirely of poor skins; prices are unchanged at 20 1/2 for prime matador, 18 to 19 1/2 for mixed, and 15 to 16 1/2 for ordinary.

Jerked Beef.—Has been in much better demand this month, and the sales amount to 59,000 qq., whereof 17,000 for Brazil at 15 to 17 1/2 lbs. and 42,000 for Havana at 13 to 15 1/2 lbs. @. This great advance in price has been in consequence of the favorable season for drying drawing to a close and a number of Spanish vessels in port requiring cargoes for Havana. The stock on hand unsold is about 23,000 qq.

Paraguay Tobacco continues to be enquired for and prices have consequently further advanced; a recent sale of 150 bales for consumption having been made at 36 1/2 for hoja buena, 34 1/2 regular, 2 1/2 media hoja, and 19 1/2 for pito.
