#### RUMORED DEFEAT OF BARON POET ALEGRE.

A body of 5,000 of the enemy crossed the Paraná at Itapua, and it is feared they will bring double that force against Baron Port Alegre, who stands a very poor chance with his 3,000 lame infantry and 7,000 cavalry that are good for nothing.
