We received yesterday the official volume of statistics for 1864. It is, of course to be regretted that these publications are always 15 months after date, which greatly detracts from their interest and value, but as the tables seem to be drawn up with consummate care we will not pass a censure upon a department yet in its infancy, but proceed to take up the at Tres returns of marriages, births and deaths allied as


