



On the 5th inst., at 9.30 a.m. the gunboats Greenhaigh, Martins and Presidente, \* with sundry canoes, left for a certain point on the Upper Para ná in order to take on board the army of Baron Port Alegre: this force is said to be abundantly supplied with horses and will bring very opportune aid to the allied army, which was obliged to come to a full stop, for want of horses and baggage-cattle. The Admiral is making great preparations apparently for a bold stroke on the enemy's fortifications in the River Paraguay. Our gunboats, iron-clads and steamers have cut away all their masts and rigging, so as to lighten them and draw less water, and it is likely the next high tide will be seized to finish the war at one blow. Large wooden sheds, for hospitals and goodsstores, are being erected on Quaran tine Island in the River Paraguay. A temporary arsenal is also being put up for mending boilers, machinery, &c.

Gen. Flores keeps continually harassing the enemy, giving them no rest within their fortified lines. Yesterday and to-day a smart firing bas been kept up on both sides. All our trenches are now concluded, but be not alarmed for this step; it is only a precaution, waiting the arrival of Baron Port Alegre's men. Corrientes, June 8th, 1866. On the 5th inst., at 9.30 a.m. the gunboats Greenhaigh, Martins and Presidente, \* with sundry canoes, left for a certain point on the Upper Paraná in order to take on board the army of Baron Port Alegre: this force is said to be abundantly supplied with horses and will bring very opportune aid to the allied army, which was obliged to come to a full stop, for want of horses and baggage-cattle. The Admiral is making great preparations, apparently for a bold stroke on the enemy's fortifications in the River Paraguay. Our gunboats, iron-clads, and steamers have cut away all their masts and rigging, so as to lighten them and draw less water, and it is likely the next high tide will be seized to finish the war at one blow.
