To the proprietors of horses.

As the winter season has now set in and the camp is improving I beg to advise horse-owners that I am ready to take charge of horses at so much per month for pasture, at the same time making myself responsible for the value of any horses lost (not including such as may die a natural death), on the following conditions:—

1st. Horses not exceeding \$600 in value will pay \$65 per month.

2nd. Horses worth from 600 to 1000\$ will pay 100\$ and horses worth over 1000\$ shall be charged 10 per cent, on their value for monthly pasturing.

3rd. Horse-owners will have to send for their horses to the estancia, and when delivering them will get a receipt from the Mayor; but when there are more than 4 horses the undersigned will send to take them or return them to town at 60\$ a head.

4th. Horse-owners may leave their animals as long as they like, but cannot take them away until first paying whatever is due for them.

5th. After 4 months of pasturing the owner will be required to pay the cost of same, and if this be not satisfied within a further term of 2 months the horses will be confiscated as property of the estancia and branded with the estancia-mark.

6th. Every horse-owner will receive a ticket bearing my signature, expressing the value of the horses left for pasture, the date and conditions.

7th. Every horse-owner shall deliver to me the "bolitos" of the horses or a copy of same, to prevent the horses being seized as stray animals.

8th. In case of a horse dying, a piece of his hide with the mark will be returned to the owner.

THE RECOLETA. The Recoleta of Buenos Ayres is a disgrace to South America, and the sooner it is shut up the better for all parties, dead and living. The 'Nacional' publishes a Municipal notice calling upon 'the owners of graves to repair the same before Sept. 30th, and those whose lease may have expired to pay up again under penalty of dispossession.'

EXPEDITION TO THE GRAN CHACO.

ENCAMPMENT AT EL REY. Don Mardoqueo Navarro, who was sent by Government to make arrangements at Goya in connection with the Chaco expedition, proceeded by water to El Rey, where he met Mr. Perkins and the other hardy pioneers in excellent health and spirits, and his journal will be read with interest, bearing upon the splendid territory of the Gran Chaco which was hitherto so little known.

Lieut. Loza, Balarce and others scrambled up as well as they can, while the rest run back into a thicket. We could not shout to them, as the pilot enjoined us silence. Presently two Indians appeared with guns, and we at once exclaimed 'stand back! what tribe do you belong to?'

Corrientes, are ordered down to Buenos Ayres and Montevideo, and several large houses are about to be hired for temporary hospitals: the reason of this is that a very serious engagement is imminent, and room must be made for the wounded. A foreign captain, who recently arrived at Montevideo, reports that an armed steamer—privateer—flying English colors, is off Lobos Island: it is supposed that this steamer is a Peruvian.

All the allied army are now newly dressed, having received new cloth uniforms. The soldiers look well in their new clothes, although the pantaloons as a general rule are all too narrow and too short. The soldiers are now great politicians, and every man who can read has his newspaper.

Fraysle Muerto in the next month. The inauguration, we are informed, will take place in September. When the earthworks may arrive at La Villanueva, which will probably be about the 20th of this month, they will be stopped for the present, as they will then be six months ahead of the permanent way, for which all the materials to finish it, to that point, are either on the spot, or on the way from England.

General Machado has accused the 'Pueblo' newspaper for some charges made by camp correspondents against him. The Governor of Corrientes has not resigned, but still holds office: he is however very discontented, and complains that the allies have turned his province topsy-turvy.

GOVERNMENTS AND BANKS.

The meeting of merchants, which took place at the Bolsa on last Monday week, to take into consideration the actual position of monetary affairs in Montevideo, as affecting the whole commerce and general interests of the River Plate, was attended by an unprecedented number of the commercial and trading community.

EDITOR'S TABLE.

Yesterday we had no mails from Montevideo: from Paraná and Santa Fé we received papers. Minister Costa, we see by our exchanges, called at Santa Fé to visit Governor Oroño; he arrived in town on Thursday afternoon per Cisne.

with, in exact concordance with their tenor, in the power resting with the holders of the obligations to 'execute' in case of non-fulfilment, and the swift and direct action of the law of 'execution.' Credit, therefore, cannot exist when there is any authority or power to stand between the debtor and his creditor, to the prejudice of the rights of the latter. It was the action of the Government to interpose against the exercise of these rights, which instantly vibrated through the whole community of the River Plata, threatening as it did not only to 'nip in the bud' the first efforts to give effect to the principle of expansion of credit, the most imperative requirement of these countries, the want of which is not only retarding their industrial and material progress in an incalculable degree, but actually affected the public credit, which has ever been on a low step, by reason of Government control and interference with monetary institutions, an influence and control which even constituted non-payment, non-compliance with obligations alike in respect of the paper money of Buenos Ayres, and the decrees of suspension of special payments and forced circulation of Montevideo.

There can be no question that the decree referred to is a very serious blow (unintentionally) at the material interests of the Rio de la Plata. It is equally certain that it is under the promptly-presented shield which the energetic attitude and action of the community interposed to ward off the blow (with meeting and protest) that hope revives.

This meeting and protest is the assertion of the trustworthiness of the public in the matter of their own credit and the bursting forth of a long-suppressed power, which says that which is dear to us we are competent to have and to keep. Blind indeed would be the rulers of these countries if they did not recognise in this the indication of the course they must inevitably follow, or go down before the force of public opinion.

Government Banks must pass away, and monetary institutions of the public and responsible to the public unequivocally and absolutely, must be created, and the law, whose functions must be swift and effective protection of the rights of the creditor, must take the place of Government control, exercised to stand between the creditor and his rights, and essentially restricting credit.

MR. NEILL'S MAY REPORT ON THE CATTLE PLAGUE IN ENGLAND AND MEAT PROSPECTS IN RIO PLATA.

Mr. Neill reports from London by the French mail of the 24th of May that the cattle plague has greatly abated, but that, as this result has been attained by the slaughter of all the animals attacked, and as the importation of cattle from Holland has been prohibited for the present by Order in Council, the price of meat is nearly as high as when the murrain was committing its greatest ravages. There is a lingering fear that, in districts where it has not been completely eradicated, it will again spread, and increase in virulence, on the return of warm weather; and this apprehension has been justified within the last few days by fresh outbreaks of the disease in several parts of the extensive cattle-producing county of York. What is even more serious than this, however, is the appearance of the plague in Ireland, which had hitherto been free from infection, and the prevalence among the cattle of that country of pleuropneumonia, or lung disease, in so aggravated a form, owing to the long continuance of north-easterly winds, that its symptoms have been mistaken, in some instances, for those of rinderpest. Ireland being, in a great measure, the stock farm of the United Kingdom, the spread of the pestilence there would be as serious a matter as the renewal of its ravages in Great Britain. Prices will, in consequence, continue high. One effect of this state of things, and which may be expected to be permanent, is the conversion of the enormous cattle traffic of the country in great part into a dead meat trade, and, as a natural consequence, a greatly

increased consumption of the meat produced in regions whose distance from England has precluded them from sharing in the cattle-trade. Among these Rio Plata must always hold a prominent place, owing to the richness and illimitable extent of its pasturage, and the suitability of its climate for the rearing of cattle and sheep; and Mr. Neill cites the late excessive drought in Australia as a reason why that country, always liable to a recurrence of the evil, can never successfully compete with Rio Plata in the supply of meat to Europe, provided that care is taken by Platine producers to supply the article of the quality and appearance required for the market. Fortunately, every day now adds to the certainty that this great desideratum will be attained in the completest manner, and in a variety of forms; but Mr. Neill again raises a warning voice as to over-reliance being placed on much English capital being, just now, embarked in any foreign enterprise, however sure to produce the most lucrative results; because, as he says, the desolating financial panic which raged in England during the month of May, and had scarcely abated at the date of his report, must continue to be severely felt in every commercial and business circle, confining capital to immediate home requirements, at least as long as the minimum rate is 10 per cent., which it promises long to be even if, by some miracle which no one seems to anticipate, a general European war should be postponed till after the Paris Exhibition, upon the success of which the Emperor Napoleon has set his heart, almost to the exclusion of the 'rectification of frontiers' which he has again just started the world by declaring at Auxerre is the special mission of his reign, and that he 'detests the Treaties of 1815,' in common with the peasantry and working classes of France, among whom he 'alone breathes freely.'
