THE NEW FARES on the WESTERN RAILWAY. The undersigned has the honor to submit, for the approbation of Government, the tariff for passengers and cargo, observing that this tariff is in accordance with the petition of brokers and merchants of the 11 Setiembre, with but slight alterations.

Freights on cargo have been reduced 60 per cent. from town to camp, and from the camp to town 33 per cent. This reduction has been introduced to meet the requirements of trade, and to avoid what heretofore occurred—namely, the carts discharging at the station, and going into town empty to look for return cargo.
