REVIEW FOR EUROPE.

There is little to communicate respecting the Paraguayan war; both armies are in the same position. The Paraguayan river is so blocked up with sunken vessels, 'torpedoes,' and posts driven down hard and fast into the bed of the river, that it is almost impossible to suppose that the fleet can make any headway until the land forces have seized the heights and driven the enemy from their present strong position. Whatever doubts may have been hitherto entertained in this regard, the news which we received per last steamer has completely silenced them. Scarcely had Admiral Tamandaré moved up with his ironclads and monitors, and taken his position in the river to bombard one of the small forts which infest the banks. when the splendid monitor, the Rio mail. The Arno brings £48,000 for de Janeyro, built in England at a cost of £150,000, was blown up by a large 'torpedo' which the enemy directed against this magnificent vessel; a mortar vessel, built expressly for the purpose of mounting immense siege mortars, also shared the same fate; one gunboat has had her boilers pierced by 68lb. balls, and is thoroughly disabled; whilst another boat was hulled in several places. RADON PORT ALEGRE'S EXPEDITION CAPTURE OF CURUZU

A BRAZULIAN IRON-CLAD BLOWN UP. The Iron King arrived on Saturday with the following striking news. On Saturday Sept. 1st, the Brazilian fleet, carrying Baron Port Alegro's army, was ascending the Paraguay River, bent on attacking Curupaity, when, about a league below that fortress, masked battery opened a terrific fire on the foremost vessels. The 'Nacional' correspondent says that this bat tery, called Curuzú, was wholly unknown to the allies, but it seems some Paragasyan deserters had given notice regarding it a few days before. The accounts of the attack are confusa. m. six Brazilian iron-clads formed in line to silence the battery, and the Janeiro, killing or wounding 10 seamen and an officer. The fight seems to have lasted all day with equal obany movement.


