Gold was much stiffer today, for what cause it is difficult to say. In the liquidation room sales were made at 25 30, and we could notice a greater disposition on the part of brokers to buy. Indeed it was said that some of the principal importing houses were securing gold at present quotations.

The bowing during this innings was very good, that of Mr. E. Neild especially calling for admiration.

The Lancashire men then went in and scored 118. The scores were certainly considerably below the average, although Mr. E. Simpson, with 47 runs, fully vindicated his well-earned character.

The 'World' was pretty confident of retrieving their laurels in the second innings, but on this occasion, alas! on how many others, the 'World' was disappointed: 59 runs saw the side out, and the victory remained with the 'county' in one innings and 11 runs to spare.

We publish further on a copy of the score, and can only add that it is most unaccountable that the 'Lancashire' men should meet with so great a success against a side composed of names so well known and frequently proved.

We are glad to notice that the cricket ground is becoming a resort of pleasure-loving people, and we think that the efforts of the committee to render the ground attractive, will at last meet that success which they deserve.
